Crash Claims The Life Of Markham Woman
Mrs. Douglas B. Allison, 43, wife of a Markham Village councillor, who was injured in a two-car crash near Unionville Saturday night, died in Scarborough General Hospital Monday afternoon.
Mrs. Allison suffered a ruptured spleen in the crash, which also hospitalized her husband and two children, Cathy, 10, and Douglas 5; and the driver of the other car, John Scott McArthur, 22, of Unionville.
Mr. Allison suffered facial cuts and a broken jaw, while his daughter suffered a fractured right thigh and his son a broken leg.
Mr. McArthur suffered a brain injury and is in critical condition.
The accident occurred on Kennedy Road, a mile north of Highway 7, just as the Allison family was returning home from a skating carnival in Unionville.

Thornhill Secondary School Holds Open House This Friday Night

Something of interest to every member of the community will be on display at Thornhill Secondary School's open house scheduled for this Friday evening from 7 to 10 p.m.

The full and interesting program includes: the art club in action, a spelling contest in the commercial department at 7:45 p.m. This department will also have displays of bookkeeping, sonograph operation, business machines in operation, shorthand notes, typewriting speed tests and a commercial office in full operation.

The English department will feature taped material, a display of written work and models and posters. Displays of fossils, weather instruments, projects (models of volcano and artesian well) and mineral testing will be featured by the geography department. The guidance staff will be available to answer questions and discuss the branches of study available at the school.

A Canadiana display will feature newspapers, textbooks and old photographs in the history department. A debate on history should also prove of great interest.

In the home economic department there will be displays of fashions and fabrics, baked goods, table settings, canning and cheese with a fashion show taking place in the gymnasium at 8 and 9 o'clock.

For modern languages, the grade 9 choir will sing at 8 and 9 p.m., grade 10 and grade 12 French conversations will be held at two different times each during the evening and the language lab will be open. Four records in Latin will be available and in the library there will be a display of new books with student librarians at work.

Films and display will be featured in the mathematics department with a variety program being presented by the boys and girls in the physical education program at 8 and 9 p.m.

Four laboratories will be open in the science department featuring textile chemistry, "Know your clothes better. They are close to you." is the theme. An exhibit of grade 10 students' summer projects will also be included.

The Scuba club's diving equipment and the flying and aero-modelling club models will be on display. The camera club will be in operation.

Architectural models and drawing, mechanical drafting and internal grinding, building construction and cabinet making, a Morgan and four sports cars will be on display in the technical department which will also feature a live fashion show by the girls, a sheet metal display and a frame summer cottage by the boys and a transmitter-receiver demonstration.

This should provide a full three hours of interest for parents and other interested residents of the area served by Thornhill Secondary School.

Art Show By Howarths This Saturday To May 9

There are rules, of course, by which to judge a piece of art but Mrs. Harold Howarth believes that if a picture stirs the imagination, offers any bit of inspiration or projects a sense of harmony it can be considered a picture worth possessing.

From May 1 to May 9 between the hours of 2 p.m. and 9 p.m. a fine selection of fifty-one paintings by Madeleine and Harold Howarth will be on display in their small gallery in their home. These pictures are on sale at moderate prices and the selection is wide enough to satisfy a variety of tastes.

In studying the display one receives a lesson in appreciation. Still life has had no attraction for me because I never really looked at it. Now as I recall a grouping, painted by Mr. Howarth, of cranberry and amber glass on green and another of amber and silver I want to go back and look at them again. It occurs to me that to get the sheen and translucency of glass as he has done, without sacrificing color, is truly art.

There are pictures that project activity. The depth behind an anchored sailboat carries the imagination as well as the eye out to sea. Handsome Clydes on the land make one feel glad that the passing scene is so well recorded. Spring scenes engage the interest of the Howarths and gives scope for a particular talent they have for shadow portrayal; water, birches, and shadows on the snow, particularly one with soft muted colors as a background for a delicately shadowed snowbank, can be studied and lived with. Another spring scene, through a mist of yellow willow branches is sense satisfying. Nostalgia possessed me as I looked at a basket pond - a bit of northern Saskatchewan in every twig and ripple. No matter from where you come you see a bit of Canada as you know it.

Mrs. Howarth said that The Group of 7 made a fine contribution to Canadian artists because they removed the binding influence of European style and encouraged Canadians to express themselves through their own medium. She offered the interesting idea that one can be over instructed with the risk of ideas of a respected teacher. Too much endeavor for perfection and detail can limit one's individual art expression. She mentioned a typical bit of Chinese psychology; that it is

RHHS Students Study Computers

On April 21, 34 senior students from Richmond Hill High School, accompanied by Principal L. B. Morrison, left by bus to attend a computer science seminar at Waterloo University.

The seminar was held in the mathematics and physics building in which are several computers: IBM 1620 computer, 1710 hybrid computer, IBM 1401 computer and a large-scale 7040 computer.

In the first lecture Paul Cress, representative of the computer centre, illustrated the method of programming IBM cards to feed the 1620 computer. The lecture was followed by a "Problems Solving Session" during which the visiting students were allowed to program problems on the function of a variable. This task demanded perfection, since a misspelling or a missing decimal point on a card, would cancel the program and the computer would answer "Error in statement . . . Program not accepted."

In the afternoon, the students assembled around the 7040 computer, used mainly for faculty and graduate student research. Mr. Cress demonstrated the working parts and the method connecting the 7040 computer with a 1401.

The seminar closed with a lecture on the various challenging careers open to graduates of computer science.
