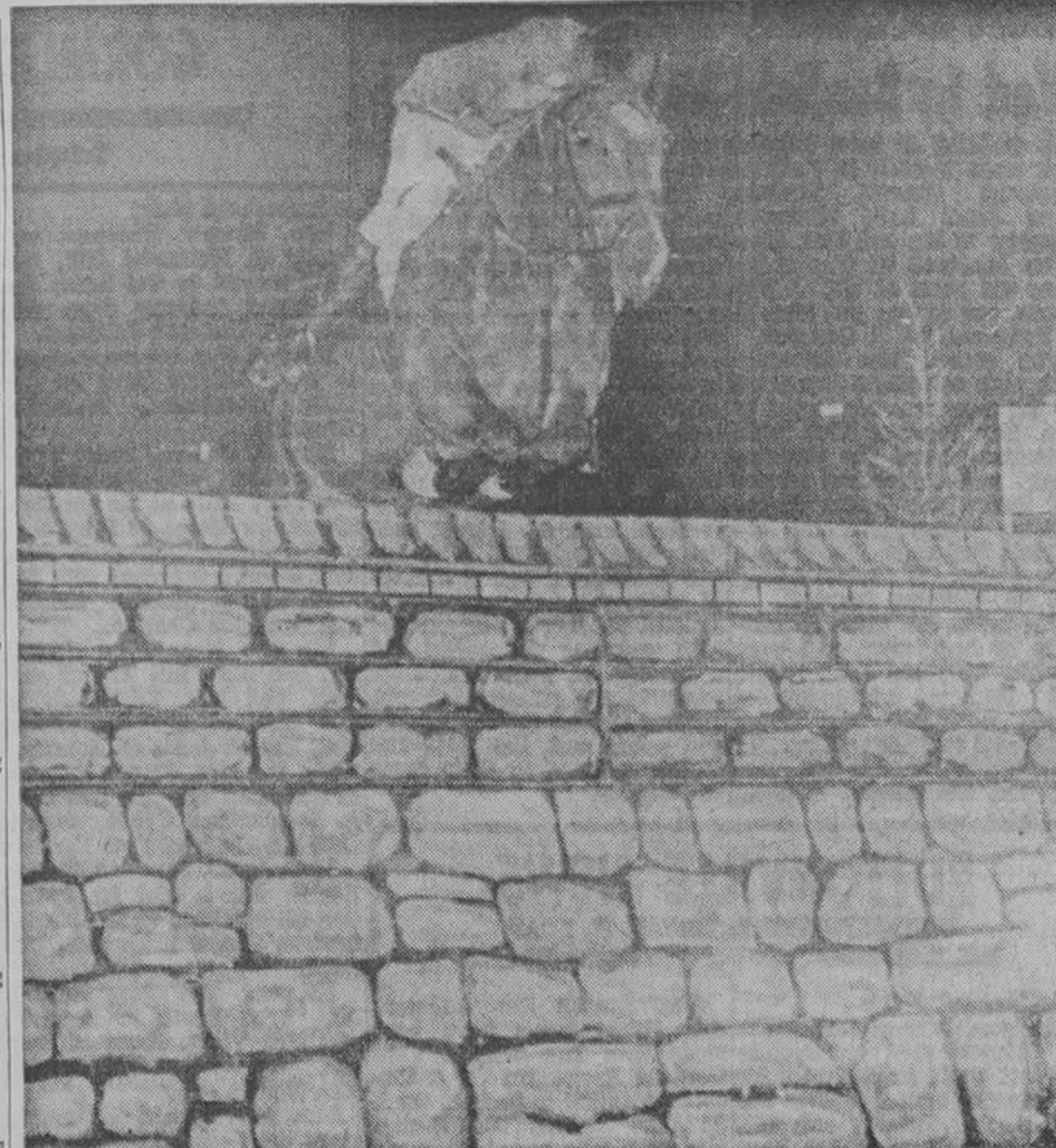

Thornhill Youth Killed In Car Crash At London

A tragic accident on Monday of this week took the life of a 22 year old Thornhill student, Robert William McChesney, son of Mr. and Mrs. William McChesney, 19 Shasta Drive. The accident occurred on the Macdonald-Cartier Freeway 12 miles east of London. A car carrying two members of a Quebec singing group, heading for London for an engagement, crossed the median and collided head-on with Mr. McChesney's eastbound car. Both the singers, Micheline Desante, 23, of Ville St. Michel and Claudette Faubert, 23, of Lachine, Quebec were also killed instantly. Mr. McChesney, a third year honors geology student at the University of Western Ontario had gone to London to file a report on a recent field trip he had made and was to have joined his class on a further geological field trip at the University's Whitefish Falls camp near Sudbury the next day. He was a graduate of De La Salle College in Toronto. Always an honor student, he was also an enthusiastic hockey and football player and played on the university's teams up until this year. The McChesneys have lived in Thornhill for eight years. Mr. McChesney is an executive with the Royal Bank of Canada and was to have taken part in the ceremonies at the opening of the new Royal Bank Building in Toronto on the day of his son's death. Mr. McChesney is survived by his parents, and two sisters, Mary Ellen and Patricia, students at Langstaff Secondary School. Requiem mass was sung in St. Luke's Roman Catholic Church, Thornhill on Wednesday with interment in Holy Cross Cemetery.

Niagara Parks Horticultural Expert Gives Simple Lawn Care Rules

Richard Hook, a graduate of Richmond Hill High School and of the Niagara Parks School of Horticulture will head the department of horticulture at Bendale Vocational School in Scarborough next September. Mr. Hook is currently collaborating with a committee on the preparation of the first textbook on horticulture to be used in Ontario schools and will also illustrate the book. The following article on care of lawns was written by him for the Richmond Hill Horticultural Society. Lawns naturally require certain basic maintenance if something more ornamental than a sheep pasture is desired. The absurdly simple operations followed in most parks are often overlooked at home. Throughout the winter twigs, stones, paper and other particles have accumulated in lawns. These must be thoroughly raked off with a fan rake. If these are not removed they will be forced into the soil, hampering the formation of a smooth sward. This should be followed by rolling. If the soil is wet, and of a clay nature, even a light roller will press the earth into a state that will become brick hard upon drying. Remember, the purpose of rolling is to force frost-heaved turf back into contact with the soil. The filling of small depressions is not accomplished by rolling but should be done by top dressing with a rich loam. Fertilizing with a recognized turf fertilizer, such as 10-6-4 or 7-7-7 is ideal at this time. Follow the manufacturer's directions, but if too much is applied, water heavily. Deactivated sewage, such as Milorganite will not burn so excesses are of relatively little danger. The European Chafer in the Niagara Peninsula, and the June Beetle in this area may have left large brown areas in the lawn. Do not spray at this

Sick Kids Hospital Needs \$13,900,000

The Hospital for Sick Children urgently needs \$13,900,000 in public donations to build new facilities and has secured the services of Mike Foyle, manager of the local branch of British Mortgage and Trust, and R. D. Little, well-known local citizen, to carry out a canvass of industrialists in this area. They will be sending letters to all manufacturers in Richmond Hill, Thornhill, Maple, King, Markham and Stouffville seeking contributions to this internationally famous 90-year-old hospital.
