Ottawa Letter

Consequently, last week Prime Minister Pearson gave notice of a series of measures aimed at speeding up the business of the Commons, which on occasion has tended to lag in recent sessions. These proposals are largely adopted from British precedents and the work of the Committee on Procedure which has met during the last two sessions.

The new measures include the extension of the hours of sitting by abolishing lunch and dinner adjournments; the allocation of time for specific major measures; the removal of the House itself to a group of standing committees; and a 36-day limit on debating money matters in Parliament each session, compared with 90 days last year. In addition, appeals from the Speaker's rulings would be abolished to strengthen his position, and the time allotted to the daily question period would be restricted.

Having sat through a number

of long, hot sessions myself, I welcome these measures with open arms as do the majority of members from all parties. It was originally thought that there would be some opposition to these reforms by the Conservatives, but apparently this is no longer true with few exceptions. All the Conservatives to whom I have spoken are fully in favour of the reforms.

The reforms would raise the average time spent on government business from 3½ hours to 5½ hours a day. The rest of Parliament's time is allotted to the question period and private member's hour. In effect, a further 7½ hours a week will be added to Parliament's time.

I heartily welcome the proposal to take discussion of government spending estimates out of the House proper and turning it over to a group of committees. This will give each private member more responsibility and a better opportunity to scrutinize the government expenditures.

The measure to disallow appeals from the Speaker's rulings, thereby giving our own Speaker the same power as he enjoys in the United Kingdom, should prove to be a definite time-saver as well as a guard against petty obstructionism but we have not as the English have done, seen fit yet to appoint a permanent Speaker; this should be done.

I was quite sure to see that there was no measure introduced which would put a time limit on the length of sessions themselves, in order for the member to spend more time in his constituency, but perhaps this will come in the near future.

In effect, I believe that these measures will all be successful in making for a far more efficient government, and a more business-like handling of the affairs of this nation.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION

TAKE NOTICE THAT: 1. The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Vaughan has made application to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval of the consolidation of the "Edgeley Water Area" created by By-law 2707 and the "Edgeley Water Area 2" created by By-law 2829 of the above Corporation. The newly created area is to be known as the "Vaughan Acres Water Area", and is to comprise the lands as set out hereunder.

FIRSTLY: The lands situate in the Township of Vaughan being bounded on the west by the easterly limit of Provincial Highway 400, on the north by the northerly limit of Lot 5 in Concession 4 and the northerly limit of Lot 6 in Concession 5, on the east by the westerly limit of the Canadian National Railway's lands being the dividing line between the east and west halves of Lots 4 and 5 in Concession 4 and on the south by the southerly limit of Lot 4 in Concessions 4 and 5.

SECONDLY: The lands situate in the Third Concession in the Township of Vaughan in the County of York being all of those parts of Lots 2 and 3 and Lots 6 to 10 inclusive lying to the west of the Canadian National Railway's right-of-way.

THIRDLY: The lands situate in the Township of Vaughan being the easterly halves of Lots 2 to 9 inclusive and those parts of Lots 10 to 14 inclusive owned by the Canadian National Railway.

FOURTHLY: The lands situate in the Township of Vaughan being the northerly 214 feet of lots 15 and 16 according to Registered Plan 3541.

2. Any person interested may within twenty-one days after the first publication of this Notice, send by registered mail or deliver to Mr. J. M. McDonald, Clerk of the Township of Vaughan at Maple, Ontario, notice of his objection to the approval of the said application, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

3. The Ontario Municipal Board may approve of the said application but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the application will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection.
