Locally Designed Medal Issued By Coin Club

Designed by Carl Lovell, a Richmond Hill boy, now resident in Willowdale, the above obverse and reverse sides will appear on a medal being issued by the Richmond Hill Coin Club. Carl's design was chosen from eighteen submitted by club members.

The obverse (front) of the medal bears a portion of the crest of the Town of Richmond Hill, which is itself a portion of the crest of the Duke of Richmond. Pictured will be a crowned lion and the words En La Rose Je Fleuris.

The reverse side (back) will bear the words, Richmond Hill, Ontario, the rose growing centre of Canada, in commemoration of the inception of the Richmond Hill Coin Club, July 1964 A.D.

The medals which will be the size of an American silver dollar are being cast by Canadian Artistic Dies, Sherbrooke, Quebec. They will be available in oxidized bronze at \$2 and fine silver .999 at \$9 by writing P.O. Box 386, Richmond Hill.

After a lively two-day election campaign which saw posters, streamers, mad costumes and foot-stomping bands brought into play, students of Richmond Hill High School last week elected the executive of their student council.

Heading the council for the next year will be David Loftus, with Vice-President Beverley Fumerton. Treasurer will be Roy Pratt and Sharon Boyman will act as secretary.

Superintendent Back To School

It's back to school for Gordon McIntyre, superintendent of Richmond Hill Public School Board.

Last week the board gave its approval to sending Mr. McIntyre to the non-credit seminar of administration to be held in Toronto, July 29 to August 6.

The seminar, which is conducted by the Ontario College of Education, will cover the approach to teaching, how to handle teaching problems and other assorted questions.

Cost of the course is \$115. The board approved the retention of Eldon Gooding as principal of Crosby Heights School when the senior wing is added in 1966, as recommended by the planning committee.

Other recommendations of the planning committee: the board move one portable classroom to Beverley Acres and one to Crosby Heights from Walter Scott School for September 1965; the board advise teachers interested in taking an intermediate course in industrial arts to apply to the superintendent for a sabbatical leave for the school year, 1965-66; confirmation be requested from Town Council that a surfaced walkway between Centre Street and Crosby Avenue, along the Sus-

sex Street right of way, and across the board. The first called for possible at all times, be opened all employees of the board for the fall term.

Permission was granted to Peter Dawson for the use of Walter Scott School grounds, May 24, for a fireworks display by the 9th Richmond Hill Cubs and Scouts.

The second called for an amendment of the board's policy requiring teachers to trans-act pupils home because of an illness or other emergency, to carry insurance from now on.

A request from the Ontario Association of School Business Officials to have Richmond Hill Public School Board Administrator Kenneth Turton join its speakers' rostrum, was fitting recognition of the administrator, Chairman Walter Hutchinson said at the board's meeting Thursday evening of last week.

The association provides speakers to school boards throughout the province for various meetings and asked that Mr. Turton be included in its list.

Expenses will be paid for by the group requiring the speaker.

Mr. Hutchinson said that Mr. Turton's work provided one of the "toughest topics," and by seeking him out, the association was recognizing his ability in this field.

Mr. Turton, who came to Canada in 1947 from Lancashire, England, joined the board as administrator in April, 1961.

Prior to that he served as a trustee and chairman of the board of education in Brantford for 13 years.

Mr. Turton, who resides at 207 Mill Street, is married and has five daughters.

Vaughan Board Meets June 10 New Office

The public will be invited to attend the June 10 meeting of Vaughan Township School Area Board which will be the first one held in its new board room. Forced to vacate the offices the board has occupied for the past five years in the Vaughan Township office building two months ago, the board decided to convert and renovate two rooms in the George Bailey annex at 136 Keele Street for this purpose.

The south room has been fitted up for the administrative staff, which is now settled there, and work is progressing very well on the north room. Trustee Ross Jolliffe reported, "Indications are that it will be equally as attractive although not as spacious as the council chambers" in which the board has met during its span of five years.

This room besides being used as a board room will also provide accommodation for the supervisors on the township school staff.

Vice-Chairman Warren Bailie will be in charge of the evening which will include a brief dedication by a township clergyman.

53% Choose Arts-Science

A possible total of 303 students from Vaughan Township will enroll in grade 9 classes in September 1965, Superintendent, D. Russell MacDonald informed Vaughan Township School Area Board last Thursday night.

Of these 35 will be attending Bayview Secondary, 155 Langstaff Secondary, nine Richmond Hill High, 80 Thornhill Secondary and 24 Woodbridge High.

161 have registered in the arts and science course, with 149 in the five year course and 12 in the four year course for 53%. Business and commerce branch has attracted 72 students, 25 of these in

the five year program, for 24%; 58 will study in the science, technology and trades branch, (only 15 of whom have chosen the five year program) for 19%; and 12 have registered for the two year diversified occupations classes for four.

The five year program has attracted 62% of the young people or 189, the four year program 30% or 91 and the two year program 8% or 23. The superintendent also pointed out that in the arts and science branch the majority of students chose the five year term, in all other branches the four year term was the most popular.
