



#### Not In Favor Of Proposed County Fire Radio Setup

Richmond Hill Council does not approve a proposed countywide fire-radio network, which would see the county paying for base equipment and for equipment placed in every municipal

The town is quite willing to pay its fair share of equipping the base station but does no approve of paying for municipal equipment when it already owns such equipment and would be quite willing to adjust it to the proper frequency. Council also looks with disfavor on paying for the cost of equipment located in other municipalities. The fire chief has been authorized to present a sample bylaw to the committee covering

lighting of outdoor fires. Councillor Walter Scudds, chairman of the fire and police commit-(Photo by Barbour) tee, explained that at present the town has no authority to stop people lighting a fire on their property. "We can put in force regulations which will control such fires to certain times and specify conditions under which they may be lighted, but we can't prohibit them," he said.

The fire chief has also been requested to obtain a draft copy of the fireworks bylaw at present under consideration by Toronto City Council to prohibit sale of fireworks within the community.


