Richmond Hill Subsidizes Ambulance

(Continued From Page 1) remain a party to the agreement.

(a) A subsidy of \$400 per month will be provided by the three municipalities on the following basis:

Richmond Hill 52.7%	\$210.80
Vaughan Twp. 32.7%	130.80
Markham Twp. 14.6%	58.40
Total	\$400.00

(b) Mr. Holt will then personally work full time on the ambulance service as well as agreeing to the other provisions of the agreement.

In moving an amendment to the recommendations, Mr. Handbury stated that provision of the best ambulance service possible should be one of council's greatest concerns. "We have been forced into this situation by the dangerous procrastination on the part of Markham and Vaughan. We should have a good ambulance service 24 hours a day and I honestly believe we should be willing to pay more to ensure that the people of Richmond Hill will have a fully manned service on that basis."

Councillor Walter Scudds, chairman of the police and fire committee, reported his committee had agreed that ambulance service is something which must be provided in a community of this size, but that the town should not provide something to benefit other municipalities if they aren't going to pay. "We have to show reasonable justification for such expenditure to our ratepayers," he stated. Mr. Scudds also noted provincial legislation is underway to control quality of equipment and personnel.

Mayor Thomas Broadhurst stated "We need an ambulance service for our own taxpayers, but feel we should not subsidize townships which are well able to assume their fair share of the costs. We must be assured that an ambulance service will be available to our residents in emergencies."

The mayor noted that both townships have partial protection from other ambulance services and Reeve Plaxton countered that they are also blanking highly developed residential areas. "Fourteen hundred homes are planned for the Thornhill area in Markham and I can see similar developments in that township and Vaughan. Why should we subsidize these people?"

The mayor explained that council is "trying frantically to keep the ambulance in existence. You have a man going out of business, who last year had only \$1700 for himself out of the operation and was forced to take a full time job, working nights. At \$200 a month we can keep the operation in existence on the same basis as it is now, with an upgrading of personnel. At \$210 a month, with the townships paying their share, the owner will not need his other job and will be able to devote his full time to the ambulance service. In a town of 20,000 people it would be criminal to ask people to wait for an ambulance from Willowdale, Woodbridge or Markham Village when we can provide this subsidy out of our budget."

Councillor Hancey commented, "Somebody has to be the leader," and the reeve retorted, "Somebody has to be the sucker, too."

"You are subsidizing the two townships," he declared. "If you think you can solve any problem by subsidizing this service, you are mistaken. Markham and Vaughan are not going to charge their ratepayers one plugged nickel. The only way you can force their

Not In Favor Of Proposed County Fire Radio Setup

Richmond Hill Council does not approve a proposed county-wide fire-radio network, which would see the county paying for base equipment and for equipment placed in every municipality.

The fire chief has been authorized to present a sample by-law to the committee covering lighting of outdoor fires. Councillor Walter Scudds, chairman of the fire and police committee, explained that at present the town has no authority to stop people lighting a fire on their property. "We can put in force regulations which will control such fires to certain times and specify conditions under which they may be lighted, but we can't prohibit them," he said.

The fire chief has also been requested to obtain a draft copy of the fireworks by-law at present under consideration by Toronto City Council to prohibit sale of fireworks within the community.
