**McCutcheon Advocates By-Election Test Of Pearson Government**  
"By-elections, indicated by four vacant seats in the House of Commons, would give opportunity for an interim verdict on the conduct of the Pearson Government... and Canada needs such warning signals directed at the two-year reign of the Liberal Government."  
Senator Wallace McCutcheon of Gormley told the Conservative nominating convention for Victoria County held in Lindsay, August 7. William Scott of Kinnmount was named to carry the Tory banner in that area in the next federal election.

Senator McCutcheon said voters could flash the green, the amber or the well-known "warning sign". He stated "Canadians have already formed judgment on the government's conduct and will express their decision at the polls whether at by-elections or anticipated federal elections."  
The senator from York County also charged that Canada has a socialist government now. He stated the new socialist technique is to transfer as much of the wealth of the country as possible from private to public hands and thereby narrow the area of private choice, to place more control and decisions in the hands of a few government planners. "This is done not only by taxation but by such compulsory schemes as the Canada Pension Plan and the proposed medicare plan," he said.

He charged that at a time when emphasis should be on expanding the Canadian economy, the nation's money will be tied up in schemes and government sponsored plans.  
Other speakers at the nomination convention included Hon. E. Davies Fulton, former Minister of Justice and Hon. Leslie M. Frost, former Premier of Ontario.
