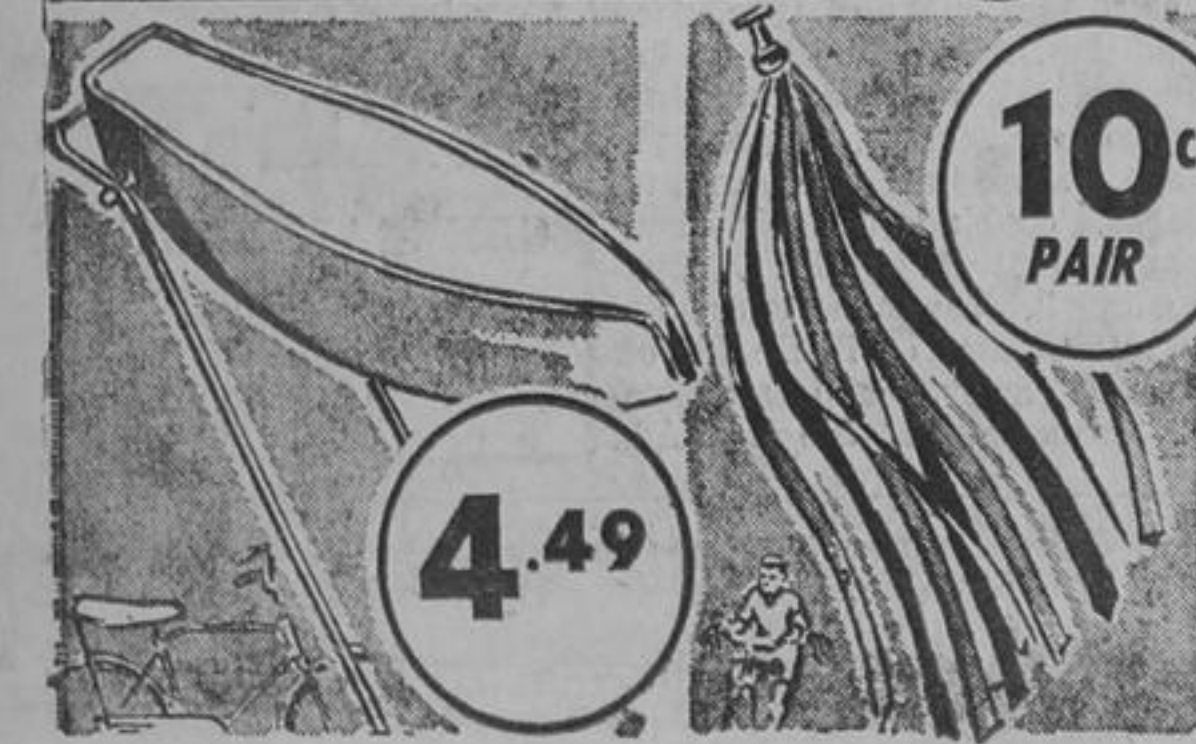

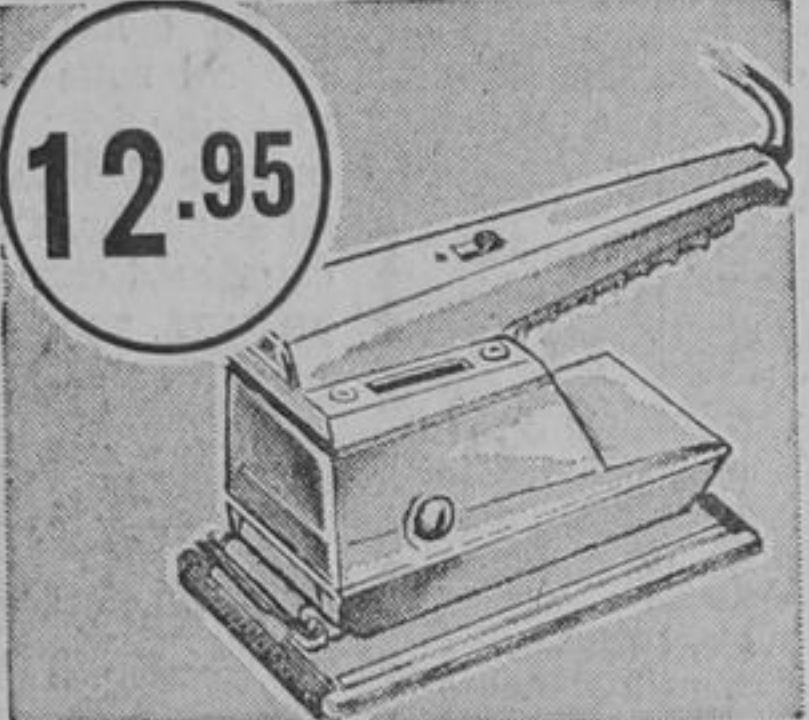

Seven Needy Korean Children Now Aided By Bayview Secondary KAP

Word has just been received by Patricia Oxley who headed up Bayview Secondary School's Korean adoption project — KAP — last year about the seven youngsters who have been receiving Bayview's aid since August.

Chung Dong Hyun, 12, is the oldest of a family of three children and is in the first grade of a night school for over-age and needy children. His family is supported by the 40¢ daily his stepfather, a laborer, and his mother earn.

Choi Jong Kook, a twin, is 11 and one of a family of six children. His father was killed in an accident a year ago. At the present time, his greatest ambition is to be a soldier.

Lee Kun is a playful eight-year-old, in the second grade of a primary school. He and his family live on a mere 20¢ a day.

OPP Continue Safety Precaution But Motor Fatality Still Occurs

Ontario Provincial Police highway patrols kept their lights on during the holiday weekend, but the Bond Lake Detachment still reported one fatal accident.

Ralph Leroy Robertson, 34, of Epsom Downs Drive, Downsview, was killed Saturday in a two-car collision on Highway 400, half a mile north of Highway 7.

Sunday night, his brother Ross Robertson, 28, also of Downsview, died in York Central Hospital, as a result of injuries received in the accident.

Two other passengers in the Robertson vehicle, James Smith, 47, and Harold Davidson, 26, both of Downsview, are in good condition at York Central.

Smith broke his hip and both legs, while Davidson broke his right leg and suffered face cuts. John Lewis Skinner, Downsview, driver of the other car, and Harold Townsend, a passenger, were both released after treatment for minor injuries.
