

Committee Approves Installation Of Hydrogen Vaughan Planning Bd. Turns Down Subdivision

While Vaughan Township Planning Board recommended to council that it not approve a proposed subdivision as premature and not in the interests of the township, council at Monday night's meeting accepted a recommendation of its building committee to delay decision on the matter until after a meeting with planning board tentatively scheduled for September 16.

Submitted to planning board by Vroom Construction of Woodbridge the proposal was for 36 one acre lots, each served by a private well and septic tank. Location of the subdivision is on the north side of Highway 7, immediately west of the Sylvan Subdivision which is at corner of Concession 7.

The plan had been submitted by the subdivider to the Minister of Municipal Affairs who had circulated it to interested authorities, including Vaughan of population.

Markham Road is of heavy block construction with steel roof, easy to seal up and substantial enough to support the steel crane necessary to lift the tops of the reactors or ovens.

He assured Mr. Jackman that hydrogen is the only carrying agency which can be used. Also answering the chairman's questions he listed approvals from Works Commissioner Otto Whalen on water consumption; from Ontario Hydro which had examined the operation and established it as a non-hazardous process, giving free choice of lighting fixtures; the Department of Labor and the Workmen's Compensation Board which had placed the process in a non-hazardous chemical preparation classification.

Mr. Jackman asked what happened if there was a hydro failure and the answer was that the hydrogen would be cut off automatically and the whole system automatically purged with nitrogen, an inert gas. There are also manual buttons which will cut off the hydrogen at the trailer and purge the system, one located at each exit door, which would be used if fire broke out in another part of the building and the employees were forced to leave hurriedly. Mr. Jackman was told, Mr. Peirce also claimed the building was about as completely fireproof as possible because of its construction. "The only thing which will burn is the back door," he commented and Mr. Post added, "And the plant."

Mr. Peirce described the operation inside the plant as unique in Canada, but a much larger operation has been carried on in Dallas for the past three years. The storage outside the building, however, is not unique, he claimed, and later Mr. Colquhoun of Canadian Liquid Air listed several similar installations used by other companies in other processes. Mr. Peirce displayed a large photograph of his company's Dallas plant showing the close proximity of the hydrogen

hydrogen rises. He replied in the negative when Mr. Jackman asked if the tank would blow if a flame started in escaping gas at the tank.

Answering Mr. Huntley's question about the explosive ratio of propane to hydrogen, Mr. Colquhoun described propane as a wonderful fuel, but because it is heavier than air, if a leak develops, the gas seeks out the lowest point of the terrain and collects there. Then a spark can cause a violent explosion. He told Mr. Huntley that his company has been in business in Canada for over 50 years and in that time has had no experience of gas storage

systems starting a fire. "I don't think there have been any such incidents with other companies," he said. He also claimed that with pressure dropping because of a leak there is no danger of air getting into the tank.

The answer to Mr. Monk's question if the burning of hydrogen would cause any odor was in the negative since when hydrogen is burned in air it forms water, and that is all that is formed.

Mr. Monk said the main concern of the people he represented was the human element, seeking information on the training which will be given personnel handling this process.

Mr. Post replied that four people are employed in the operation at the moment. They were hired in Richmond Hill and sent to Dallas to work for two months under men who have worked in this operation for the past three years. Besides this, he reported, each operator has at his work station a set of written operating instructions which he must follow. "There has been no incident in Dallas," he declared, "which has caused any loss of time by men or machinery."

The chairman of the public school board reportedly quite concerned over the proximity of the installation to Walter Scott School. "While as a trustee I feel there is still an area of concern, personally I believe the hazard we are exposed to here is no greater than the hazards we are exposed to with gasoline and propane trucks passing even closer to the school. We have expressed a concern for the safety of the children. The decision is yours to make," he told the committee. Mr. Hutchinson added he felt if the application were approved, a good substantial fence should be required.
Mr. Meisner objected strongly to the installation because of its proximity to the school and the residential area. "I feel there is still a danger," he said adding that this also was the stand of the Citizens' Safety Committee. Mr. Jackman read a lettered from the Citizens' Safety Committee opposing the application, and one from the fire chief.
Chief Alf Stong stated every fire precaution is being observed, but noted the building is shared by a clothing factory and a factory where plastic valves are assembled. He quoted a conversation with an engineer of the Ontario Fire Marshal's department who recommended greater separation of the tank from the building and the side lot line and stated it should not be located near any residential section of the town. The chairman also referred to a large stack of letters from individuals, all opposing the application.
