# York North Candidates Busy Ringing Doorbells

Liberal standard-bearer in the  
November 8 election, John Ad-  
dison, will be visiting many  
areas of the riding this week,  
conducting a house-to-house  
campaign.  
Monday found him campaign-  
ing at the Woodbridge Fair, and  
Wednesday at the opening of  
the International Plowing Match  
at Milliken, with federal Agri-  
culture Minister Harry Hays.  
He also participated in the rib-  
bon cutting ceremony at the  
Jaycee booth at this interna-  
tional match.

bridge Fair with A. A. Macken-  
zie, Tory MLA for York North.  
On October 4, Mr. Martyn  
spoke at the Gormley home of  
Eric Baker, in Markham Town-  
ship. At this meeting he at-  
tacked his Liberal opponent's  
election advertising, particularly  
in regard to commuter trains.  
The advertising, Mr. Martyn de-  
clared was "vague and deliriously  
misleading".  
"When he talks of commuter  
service being 'hopefully well on  
its way to reality', Mr. Addison  
is surely exaggerating. What  
traffic studies have been taken?  
What concrete steps have been  
made? What feasibility studies  
conducted? Three and a half  
years of talks, and Mr. Addison  
talks today of reality. Perhaps  
this is another veiled statement  
similar to the exaggerations of  
federal Resources Minister Ar-  
thur Laing".  
Mr. Martyn concluded that he  
would be most pleased if such  
a service were actually to come  
into operation in the near fu-  
ture, as he is a commuter him-  
self, but that "half truths and  
slogans have no place in this  
campaign".
