ing Our Children". Noting that psychiatric application to children's problems is a development of the last 25 years and in Ontario of the last 10 years, Dr. Hughes stated it has only begun to grapple with the problems and has not yet come up with a panacea.

However, he reported that there are some things about behavior which are fairly well established in principle if you have understanding. All behavior is motivated, has a reasin, he stated. In some cases it may be undiscovered and in others it cannot be removed.

Motivation comes in general from people's attempts to make themselves more comfortable. If you want to control behavior you must excel in understanding of its motivation. What we do about behavior problems has a terrific part to play", he continued. Speaking as a parent of four children, "and I can't understand them , Dr. Hughes cautioned that a parent needs to be flexible about decisions about motivation. 
