Last Warning For 17-Yr. Old Youth Car Theft Charges

A 17-year old youth was saved from a jail sentence, but given his "last warning," when he appeared in Magistrate's Court last week for sentencing on three different charges.

Magistrate O. S. Hollinrake told Walter Dowell, of the House of Concord, that he didn't think he was a criminal, "just a very unwise young man." As a result he was going to suspend sentence for one year on two charges of car theft and one of wilful damage. He said a presentence report had spoken favorably of the youth.

"I don't think anything can be gained by sending you to jail," said Mr. Hollinrake. "I think you've now realized that it's time to stop being foolish."

As terms of his probation,

Dowell, whose mother testified at an earlier hearing that she had "no control over him", must continue to live at the House o' Concord, unless the court g as him permission to move; he must report to a probation officer at least once a month; must not leave the area without permission; stay out of liquor

A Woodbridge man, who was fined \$100 and costs, or 10 days in jail when he was convicted on a charge of driving while under suspension, was advised to take the jail sentence by Magistrate O. S. Hollinrake when he appeared last week in magistrate's court.

Robert Robinson, 24, pleaded guilty to the charge, which arose out of an accident in Vaughan Township, October 18. According to Police Constable James Mabley, Robinson was driving along a back road when he was hit by a car, driving without any lights. The wayward car then sped off.

Robinson said he and a friend were taking the car back to Woodbridge, where he intended to fix it up and sell it.

When Magistrate Hollinrake asked why the passenger hadn't driven it instead, he was informed that the latter was impaired.

The accused lost his licence In April, 1963 when he failed to satisfy a judgment of \$400. It was because he still owed this money that Mr. Hollinrake suggested he take the jail term and apply the money he'd be spending on his fine on the judgment.
