Whitchurch To Oppose Aurora Annexation

Reeve Ross Farguharson confirmed to "The Liberal" this week that Whitchurch Township would oppose any possible annexation of part of the township by Aurora.

Aurora has filed an intention with the Municipal Board to annex 175 acres Patient Transportation of Whitchurch south of the town limits on the east side of Yonge Street.

Reeve Farquharson stated that council is assured the people living in the area do not wish to become part of Aurora. The township is also reluctant to lose the assessment in the area which includes that of the Canadian Tire Corporation store and the Sunoco Service station.

The land to be annexed would have about half a mile of Yonge Street frontage and extend about 200 feet south of the subway sideroad, Reeve Farguharson stated.
