

New Look, Old Problem

The "new look" Richmond Hill Dynes Jewellers Hockey Club has been winning in fairly consistent fashion this season but still can't get fans to come

Things are pretty tough when you start considering a turnout of 38 to 40 fans a game is an improvement. But that's the case.

An average of about 40 have been wandering down to the town arena to view the action in recent games and club officials expect - and hope - that the ones that come will bring a few hundred more with them as part of a New Year's resolution.

Late Starting

Some of the difficulty this year has been the late starting time of 9 pm. This means the stoptime games aren't completed until around 11 pm and that's pretty late if you're a commuter and have to rise with your neighbor's barking dog the next morning.

The club itself has an impressive lineup of hockey talent right from goaltender Doug Finney out. Finney, who was the top goalie in the newlynamed York-Simcoe Hockey Association in 1964-65,

is off to a slow start this season. But part of the blame can be placed on his defence which is the weakest - although not that weak - portion of this year's team.

Defence Weak

You have to be weaker when you lose two defencemen the calibre of Pat Merraw and Don Haynes. Both have decided to abandon the skates this season.

Haynes, in particular, is a big loss. He was a two-way, hard-hitting fellow who was much in demand by a number of area teams. He might make a comeback at age 26 later in the season but it probably won't be with Richmond Hill.

Filling the two vacancies on defence are newcomers Arnold Roberts and Ed Burford. Roberts is a rugged type from Thornhill and adds enough muscle to the backline but report has it he draws his share of penalties under the more genteel Olympic hockey rules in force in the league. Burford is just out of Junior B ranks.
