Police Accident Report

Richmond Hill Man Charged With Dangerous Driving After Mishap

A Richmond Hill man has been charged with dangerous driving following an accident in Markham Township Saturday night.

John Schullin 23, of 12 Church Street, was one of four motorists charged with traffic offences in six separate accidents during the weekend in the township.

The charge against Schullin arose out of an accident on Don Mills Road about 11:20 a.m., when he allegedly drove his car into the side of a vehicle as it was about to turn into the Donway Fruit Market.

Driver of the other car was Donald Jarvis, Don Mills. Schullin appeared in Magistrate's Court Tuesday and was remanded for three weeks.

In another accident, Herbert Van Dyke, RR 2, Aurora, was charged with careless driving after he skidded into the rear of a car driven by Keith Preston, Concession 5, Whitchurch Township.

The accident occurred December 19 about 12:30 p.m. on 14th Avenue and Concession 5.

Mr. Preston told police he had been stopped waiting for westbound traffic when he was hit from the rear by another car.

Mrs. Preston, who was a passenger in her husband's car received minor injuries.

The other two charges laid by police were both for failing to yield the right of way.

Charged were Gordon Unterman, RR 1, Milliken, and Donald K. Jackson, 28 Elmridge Acres, Thornhill.

Mr. Unterman was charged after he allegedly pulled out in front of another vehicle as it drove west on Steeles Avenue and Don Mills Road, December 17.

Driver of the other car was Sherwood Smith, Pickering.

Mr. Jackson was charged following a collision on Bayview and Proctor Avenues December 18, about 3:10 p.m.

Driver of the other car was David Richards, 243 Dunville Avenue, Willowdale.

Police are also considering laying charges as a result of an accident on Don Mills Road in Victoria Square, about 5:50 p.m., Saturday.

The accident occurred when Mathias Mosel, Stouffville, allegedly drove out of a private driveway on Don Mills Road into the path of a car driven by Charles Kelly, Toronto.

Ice was blamed for the other accident in the township, involving cars driven by Vittorio Quattrocchio, Toronto, and Mrs. P. Welch, RR 2, Markham.

Police said the first car hit an icy spot after braking to avoid hitting the Welch vehicle when it stopped to make a turn on 14th Avenue, near Kennedy Road.

Vaughan Township reported one accident on the weekend.

Damage estimated at \$350 was done to cars driven by Joseph Robinson and Robert McDonald, both of Maple in a rear-end collision December 17, about 5:10 p.m. on Keele Street, north of Highway 7.
