### 96% Markham Building Permits For Family Homes

More than 96 percent of the value of building permits issued in Markham Township during the month of August were for single family detached dwellings. Total value of the permits was \$1,027,500. Of this amount \$972,500 was for residences, \$14,850 for additions to eight dwellings, and \$7,300 for four accessory buildings (residential).

Also included were one addition to a commercial building valued at \$15,000; one industrial building, valued at \$16,000; two signs at \$1,350; and demolition of a commercial building at \$500.

Seventy-three building permits brought the township \$2,321 in fees and 16 septic tank permits brought \$96, for a total of \$2,417.

Building Inspector William Craig also presented a comparison of the total value of building for the month of August from 1960 to 1965 inclusive.

In 1960 total building value was \$707,050, which included \$531,000 for residences, \$52,000 for industrial and commercial buildings and \$4,050 for accessory buildings.

In 1961 the total was \$342,150, including \$306,000 for residences, \$3,200 for accessory buildings, \$32,450 for industrial and commercial and \$500 for public buildings.

In 1962 the total was \$677,258, including \$367,300 for residences, \$7,968 for accessory buildings, \$171,050 for industrial and commercial and \$130,940 for public buildings.

In 1963 the total was \$157,250, including \$134,700 for residences, \$3,250 for accessory buildings, \$18,000 for industrial and commercial and \$1,800 for public buildings.

In 1964, the total was \$242,100, including \$187,900 for residences, \$14,000 for accessory buildings and \$40,200 for industrial and commercial.

In 1965, the total was \$786,050, including \$519,500 for residences, \$5,850 for accessory buildings and \$260,700 for industrial and commercial.

(Continued from Page 1) application to the OMB for permission to proceed with the work at a cost of \$300,000.

An attempt was made to cut costs by reducing the underground water storage capacity to 250,000 gallons from 500,000 gallons but as the saving was only \$16,000 and the larger reservoir was considered more desirable, it was decided to ask the OMB to approve the \$25,000 additional. Estimates of the work had been made almost a year ago and the tenders were slightly higher.

Three contracts were opened Monday night for the double chip surfacing of Elder Mills Sideroad. These were from Miller Paving, \$11,380; W. A. Ryder Paving Ltd., \$14,395 and Royal Paving Ltd., \$10,560.

A member of the engineering staff was given the tenders to study during the evening and at the close of the meeting, on his recommendation, the contract was awarded to the low bidder, Royal Paving Ltd.

Two resolutions were also passed awarding individual contracts for the Sherwood Fire Hall, Keele Street which is, in the main, being built by township employees. A contract in the amount of \$2,110 was awarded to All Way Roofing Ltd., Scarborough for the supply and installation of roofing for the building. A \$915 contract was given to Overhead Door Co. (Canada) Ltd. of Scarborough for the supply and installation of three overhead doors.

A contract was also awarded to Decker Contracting Limited for the construction of water and sewer services on Boves Road to serve Interprovincial Inks Limited. Cost was \$3,722.16 but this will be paid by Interprovincial Inks along with 6 percent engineering costs and other incidentals.

The \$9,037.25 contract awarded last week was to Street Construction Ltd. for an asphalt sidewalk on Garden Avenue, Richvale.
