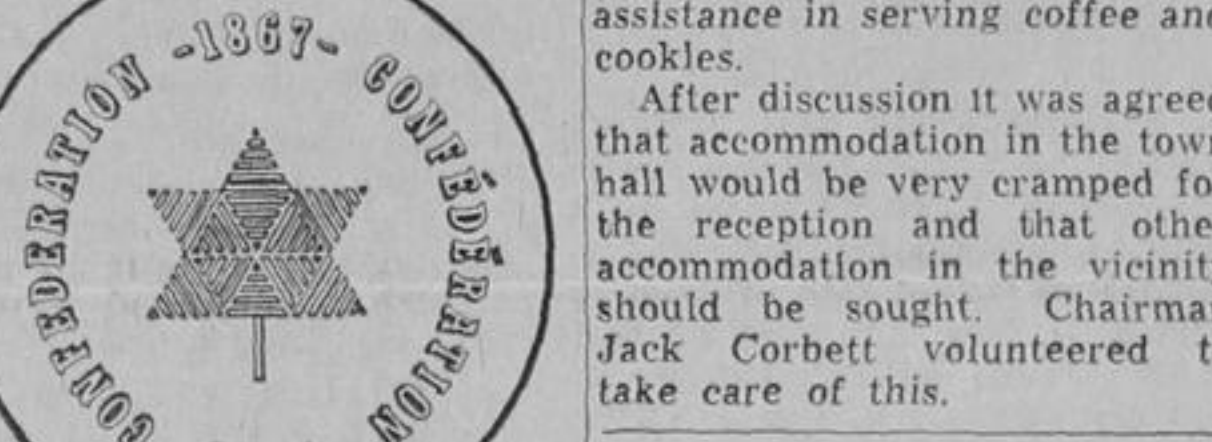

penalty of \$300, exclusive of costs.
In moving the first and second readings of the bylaw only, Councillor McArthur observed that he would like a chance to study it a little more carefully before its third reading. It was agreed that third reading would be given at council's final meeting of the year, December 19.
The bylaw is a regulatory one which can be amended at any time and presumably will give council a firm position from which to bargain with Metro if the township is forced to accept Metro wastes as provided under recent provincial legislation.

The fourth bylaw passed referring to dumps was an amendment to Bylaw 2523. This latter is a general zoning bylaw but one section of it includes regulations respecting the operation of dumps, specifying prohibition of burning, depth of fill, etc. As this section is not really concerned with control of land use which is the reason of the bylaw, and the regulations are now dealt with under the new dump control bylaw, this section of 2523 is deleted.
The township's position then, as it faces a possible onslaught of pressure from Metro for more dumps, is that any such dumps would come under the new dump bylaw with its stiff conditions and which can be amended as the need arises; Norman Goodhead's dump is subject to the same conditions and if he violates them, bylaw 3312 could be quickly revived and the township could go into court asking that his dump be closed, in a stronger position, having demonstrated its attempt to co-operate with him.

Young Citizens Offer Services To Town's Centennial Committee

Two younger citizens of Richmond Hill attended the December 1 meeting of Richmond Hill Centennial Committee to offer their services. Gary King, medal-winning accordionist, offered his services to the committee any time during the year, and agreed to provide a list of other talented young people who can make valuable contributions to the year's program.
Nita Corbett suggested that a beauty contest, with the winner to be named "Miss Centennial" or "Miss Richmond Hill", would make an interesting event for the year. The committee agreed to pass this suggestion on to a group which might be interested in taking this on as a project for Centennial Year, pointing out that the committee's prime function is to co-operate the activities of all local groups.
John Graham presented each member of the committee with an LP record "Canadian School Days 1867-2067". This record was prepared by CFGM and has been sent at no cost to every elementary school (public and separate) in Metro and York County and to every radio station from coast to coast as the local radio station's contribution to Canada's Centennial year.

partment was in 1956 with the addition of one pumper. There are now two pumpers, a 1946 Ford which pumps 420 gallons a minute, and a 1956 International which pumps 625 gallons a minute.
In 1965 there was a decrease in volunteers. In the same period the population increase was 14,553 and building assessment increase was \$27,944,495.

"In simple terms", the report reads, "our population has quadrupled or increased 300 percent and our building assessment has increased 900 percent."
"We are required to give fire protection to this increased population and building assessment with less facilities than we had in 1956."
The report also revealed the municipality had been advised that the insurance underwriters had found it necessary to increase the fire insurance rates this year in all municipalities without a permanent fire department.

party after his victory had been conceded, Mr. Dennison said he would press for the development of the 630-acre former Langstaff Jail Farm for a "planned community" of public housing.
Last September, Mr. Dennison was quoted in a Toronto daily as saying he would propose a "vast housing complex for up to 20,000 people on the city-owned property."
He said he had been negotiating with Ontario Housing Corporation and an investment company, and the latter had offered to purchase part of the farm to build 5,000 to 6,000 low-rental public housing units, to be managed by the OHC.
Council later met with Mr. Dennison, fellow controller, Margaret Campbell, and Dave Alexander, city property commissioner, to discuss the situation, but nothing was decided at that time.
The township, however, would like the area for industrial and commercial development.
