The township's position

then, as it faces a possible onslaught of pressure from Metro for more dumps, is that any such dumps would come under the new dump bylaw with its stiff conditions and which can be amended as the need arises; Norman Goodhead's dump is subject to the same conditions and if he violates them, bylaw 3312 could be quickly revived and the township could go into court asking that his dump be closed, in a stronger position, having demonstrated
