No Ice Rinks Separate Schools

There will be no skating rinks at Our Lady Help of Christians or St. Mary Immaculate Separate Schools this year, according to a decision reached by Richmond Hill Separate School Board at its meeting on

December 11. Earlier in the month the town's parks board had offered to install a rink at each school with construction and maintenance to be taken care of by the parks department. A rink on a parkette just outside the school gates has served St. Joseph's School since its

opening. However, an unpleasant experience with a rink operated by the Holy Name Society some years ago, and increasing costs of broken windows and other vandalism, led to the board's decision. It was pointed out that public school parkland, but this does not apply to separate school grounds. The rinks would require the gates being left open on weekends when custodians are not present, leaving the school property unprotected.
