**Markham TSA 2**

**Need 2 More Buses For School Children**

Transportation problems in TSA 2 Markham will be eased after January by the addition of two buses. One from the Morton Bus Lines will operate in Zone 3 and one from the Heise Lines will operate in Zone 1.

At the last meeting of the board two transportation committee reports were received. Trustees agreed that the additional equipment would be the "only possible solution". Stuart Watson, transportation chairman, who has had a difficult time arranging bus routes since the end of the shift system at Unionville, said that the whole operation seemed considerably smoother for the past week. He added with evident astonishment that he had received a complimentary call, the first of its kind, when a parent telephoned to say she "couldn't be happier".

Administrator Wilfred Morley was also hopeful of better times to come. "There has not been one single complaint since yesterday," he commented.

Mr. Morley also pointed out that the January class (children who will be six years of age, after the first of the year, who will be enrolled in grade 1) would create added pressure. "The January class must be out of school by three pm," he declared. "They're tired!"

**16 Young Indians Here For Holiday**

Sixteen high school students from the Cape Croker Indian Reserve are going to have a wonderful holiday this week. They will be guests of an equal number of young people of the Richmond Hill United Church from Wednesday night until Saturday morning and their hosts have arranged a full program. They attend regular high school courses in either Warton or Owen Sound.

Wednesday night the eight boys and eight girls, who are members of the young people's organization of the United Church on the reserve, were welcomed to Richmond Hill at a banquet.

Thursday (today) the entertainment will start early and continue well into the evening hours. The young visitors and their hosts and hostesses will journey to Toronto to watch the Maple Leafs work out at the Gardens. They then will enjoy a conducted tour of the new city hall and skating on the artificial ice rink in Nathan Phillips Square. In the afternoon they will visit the Royal Ontario Museum and in the evening will journey to Yorkdale for shopping and a show.

Friday they will be bowling at Allencourt Lanes in the afternoon and partying at the church in the evening. The local young people have plans for morning entertainment also, which could not be announced at the time of writing. Saturday morning the young people will return to their homes on the reserve.

The Cape Croker Indian Reserve is located on the shores of Georgian Bay about 15 miles north of Warton, and contains about 700 Indians. Many of the men are employed in a furniture factory and several of the women have become proficient in silk screening on cloth and on paper. They have studied design and their products are receiving a ready sale wherever offered.

**Heavy Damage In Whitchurch Fire**

Damage estimated at \$3,000 was done to a farm house near Stouffville, December 23, in the only fire reported in the area during the Christmas holiday weekend.

The lone blaze occurred at the home of Mrs. Shirley Warren, RR 3, Stouffville, about 8.30 pm, and was believed to have started from an overheated stovepipe.

The interior of the house and the roof were destroyed. Fire engines from Stouffville and Uxbridge responded to the call.

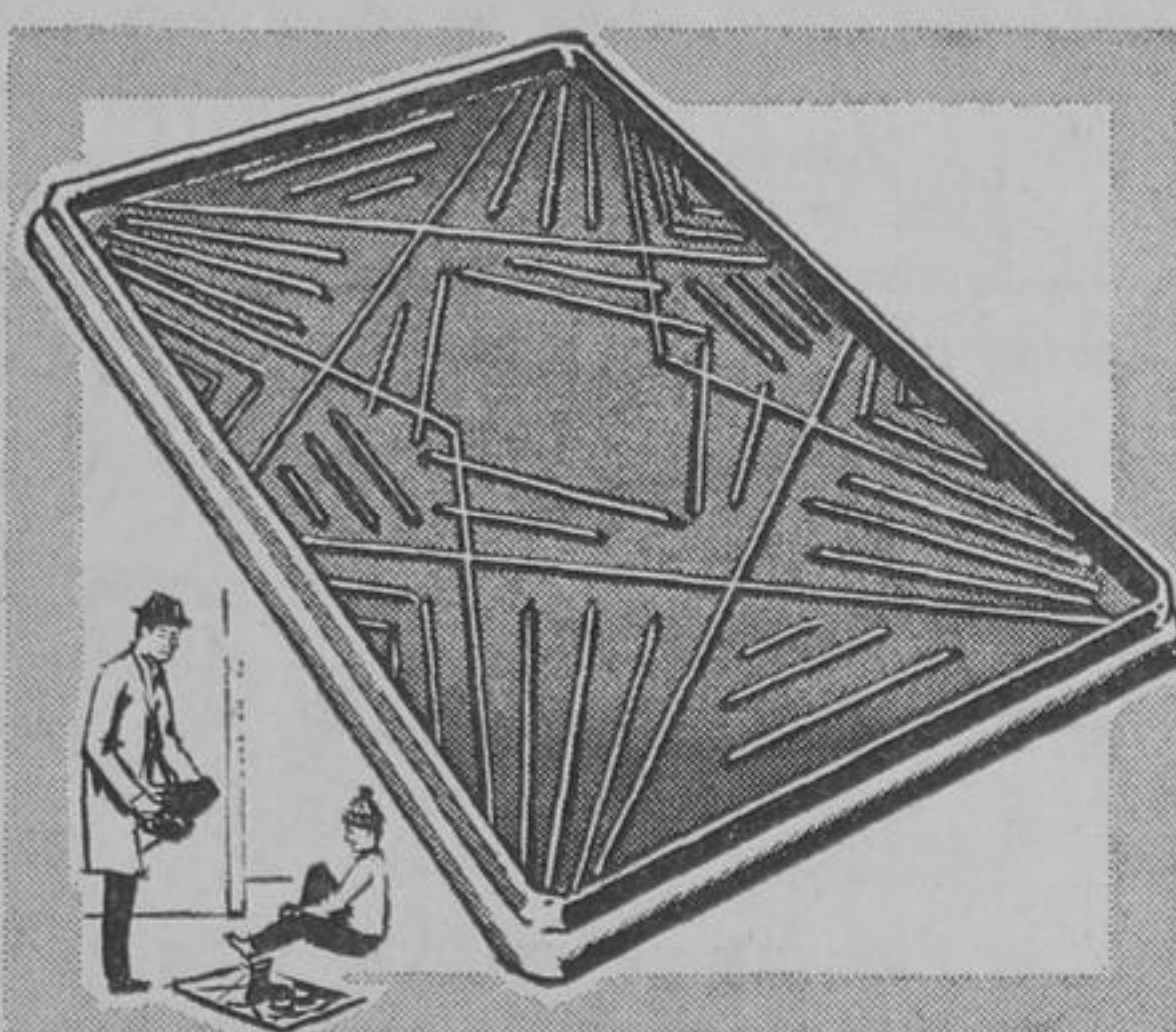
