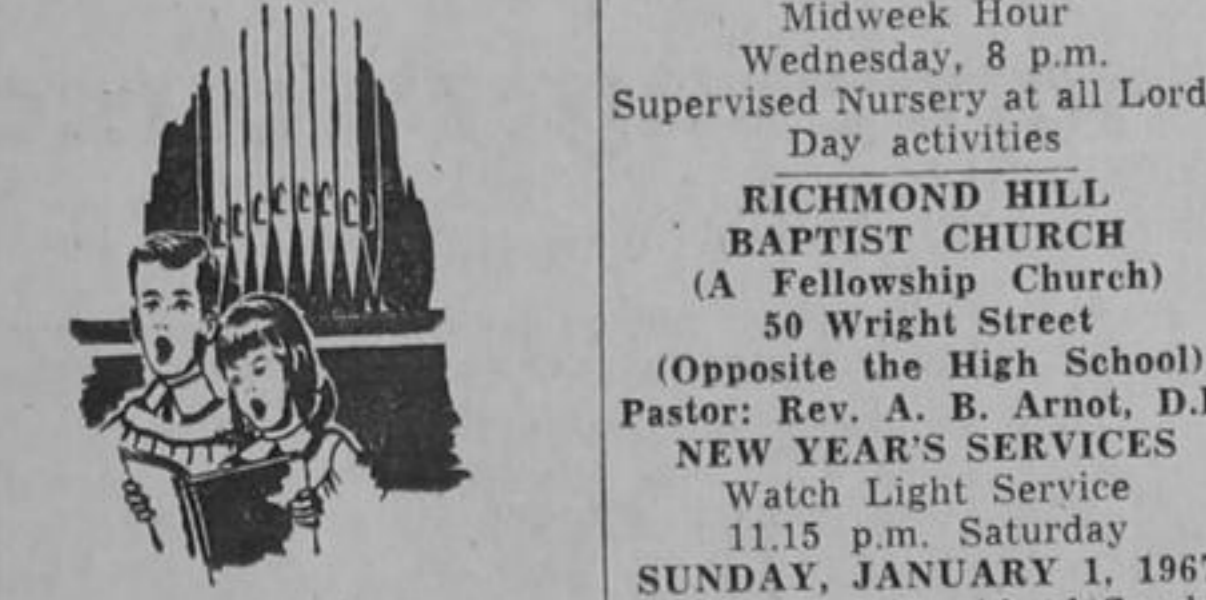

### Police Accident Report

## Injuries, Charges Follow Mishap

A three-car collision in Richmond Hill December 23, resulted in three people receiving minor injuries and the driver of their car being charged with careless driving.

The accident occurred on Yonge Street, just north of the Levedale Road traffic lights, and involved cars driven by Jack Hart, Aurora; John Kunnappu, Toronto, and Mrs. Vera C. Ross, 251 Richmond Street, Richmond Hill.

Mrs. Ross, who was charged following the accident, suffered a cut lip, while her two children, James, 4, and Nada, 6, suffered facial abrasions and shock. They were all treated at York Central Hospital.

Police said the Ross vehicle struck the car driven by Mr. Kunnappu, which in turn bounced into the other car.

In another accident the same day, Lawrence Allison, 232 Brownale Crescent, was charged with careless driving.

Mr. Allison's car was in collision with a vehicle driven by John W. Briscoe, 357 Brownale Crescent, on Bayview Avenue.

Damage to the two cars was about \$300.

The third accident of the day resulted in a charge of parking in front of a fire hydrant against A. R. LaFleur, 15 Yonge Street South.

Mr. LaFleur's car was involved in an accident with a car driven by Roland Haarer, 420A Yonge Street South.

Kenneth Robinson, Lake Wilcox, has been charged with making an unsafe lane change, following an accident December 24 on Yonge Street and Maple Sideroad.

Mr. Robinson's car was in collision with a vehicle driven by Peter King, Willowdale.

Total damage was estimated at \$300.

An accident on Main Street in Unionville December 26, resulted in \$400 damage to cars driven by two Unionville residents.

Drivers were Ernest J. Blundell, 22, and Dudley Witney, 40, RR 1, Markham, and Warren F. Layton, also of RR 1, Markham. Damage to their vehicles was \$800.

Mr. Blundell has been charged with careless driving.

Two other accidents in the township resulted in two of the cars involved being completely wrecked.

Destroyed was a car driven by Siegfried Saalfeld, 34, Keswick, which turned over on Don Mills Road after the driver allegedly lost control.

Mr. Saalfeld suffered cuts to his face.

In the other accident, in which three cars were involved, a 1966 vehicle, driven by Louise E. Burkholder, 17, of Markham Township, was demolished.

Miss Burkholder escaped injury.

The accident occurred about 7:10 p.m. December 23, on Concession 9 at Highway 7 when the Burkholder vehicle allegedly bounced off two other cars, which were making a left turn, and then rolled over.

Drivers of the other cars were Linda Anne Brunton, 27, RR 1, Markham, and Warren F. Layton, also of RR 1, Markham. Damage to their vehicles was \$800.

### 46 Years In The Ministry

## Rev. F. Bennett Retires Sunday From St. John's Baptist Church

This Sunday, Rev. Frederick Flint Bennett will be preaching his final sermon as minister of St. John's Baptist Church, 75 Oxford Street, Richmond Hill.

Mr. Bennett came to Richmond Hill only three years ago, to head the congregation which at that time was only two years old. During that time he has made many friends throughout the community as well as in his own congregation. The Bennetts live on Chassie Court.

Born in Toronto, he was educated in Toronto Public Schools and at Humberstone Collegiate before attending McMaster University when it was in Toronto. He graduated from that university in 1925 and was ordained into the ministry in 1926.

Then Mr. Bennett served as chaplain in the Canadian Army Overseas during World War II, returning to further pastorate in Ontario.

Of late years he has specialized in building churches — a Christian education building at the First Baptist Church in Galt, and organized and built Pleasant Park Baptist Church in Ottawa, from which he came to Richmond Hill at the request of the church extension board to guide St. John's through a building campaign. It is three years since he was appointed to this field and the work for which he came is done, the first unit of the church being up and in use for the past eight months.

It is 46 years since Mr. Bennett preached his first sermon and over 40 years since he was ordained. Mr. and Mrs. Bennett now plan what may be called an "active retirement," in which, without assuming the full responsibilities of another pastorate, Mr. Bennett will be available for supply preaching and any other work in which he can serve at a change of pace, if not a slower one.

The Bennetts hope to have some time to give to their hobbies, of which not the least is color-photography, and spending more time developing their Haliburton cottage and site. This is where they usually meet their son and daughter with their families during the summer (at other times they live in Chicago and in Winnipeg).

A successor for the work in St. John's Church is under consideration by the Department of Canadian Missions of the Baptist Convention of Ontario and Quebec, but he has not been named as yet. "Whoever, he is, I wish him blessing and success here, where we have found such a warm welcome and made many friends, both in the churches and around the town," Mr. Bennett told "The Liberal".

Services and Sunday school activities will continue to be held regularly at the church on Oxford Street until Mr. Bennett's successor is appointed.

Mr. Bennett went to Bolivia as a missionary of the Canadian Baptist Foreign Mission Board and there married Miss May Wallis of Toronto, also a graduate of McMaster. They served with the mission until 1935.

Further studies at the University of Western Ontario in London was followed by pastorate in Ontario (due to Mrs. Bennett's health they were unable to return to South America).

## Ghana's Principal Nurse Learns About VON In Richmond Hill

A recent guest of the Richmond Hill unit of Victorian Order of Nurses was Mrs. Miriam M. Hornsby-Odoi, principal public health nurse for Ghana, who is on a six-month observation tour on a World Health Organization fellowship. She is spending three months in Canada and a month each in the U.S.A., Jamaica and India.

Mrs. Hornsby-Odoi is married, her husband being a lecturer in architecture at the University of Science and Technology in Kumasi. They have three children. She took her basic preparation for public health nursing in Ghana and an administration course in public health nursing in Liverpool, England.

She told local members of the VON that there is no service such as that provided by the Victorian Order of Nurses in Ghana at present. There are public health nurses doing in Canadian departments of health and county health units.

Ghana has a population of 7.5 millions, served by 120 qualified health nurses. Their preparation consists of three years in a hospital school of nursing, one year studying public health nursing at a school of hygiene, and a year preparing to be a midwife. These nurses are assisted by 151 auxiliary community health nurses, who have two years training in the public health field. These nurses and assistants provide school service, maternity and child welfare services, special services to tuberculosis and leper patients and those who have malnutrition or are orphans.

Infant mortality is high, but Mrs. Hornsby-Odoi says that it could be reduced by use of more staff to provide the necessary services. The government in Ghana is working toward an expansion of health services and it is hoped that some bedside nursing in the homes may be gradually introduced.

Mrs. Hornsby-Odoi was interested to hear that the Richmond Hill VON has just recently made service available to patients needing their care throughout York County.
