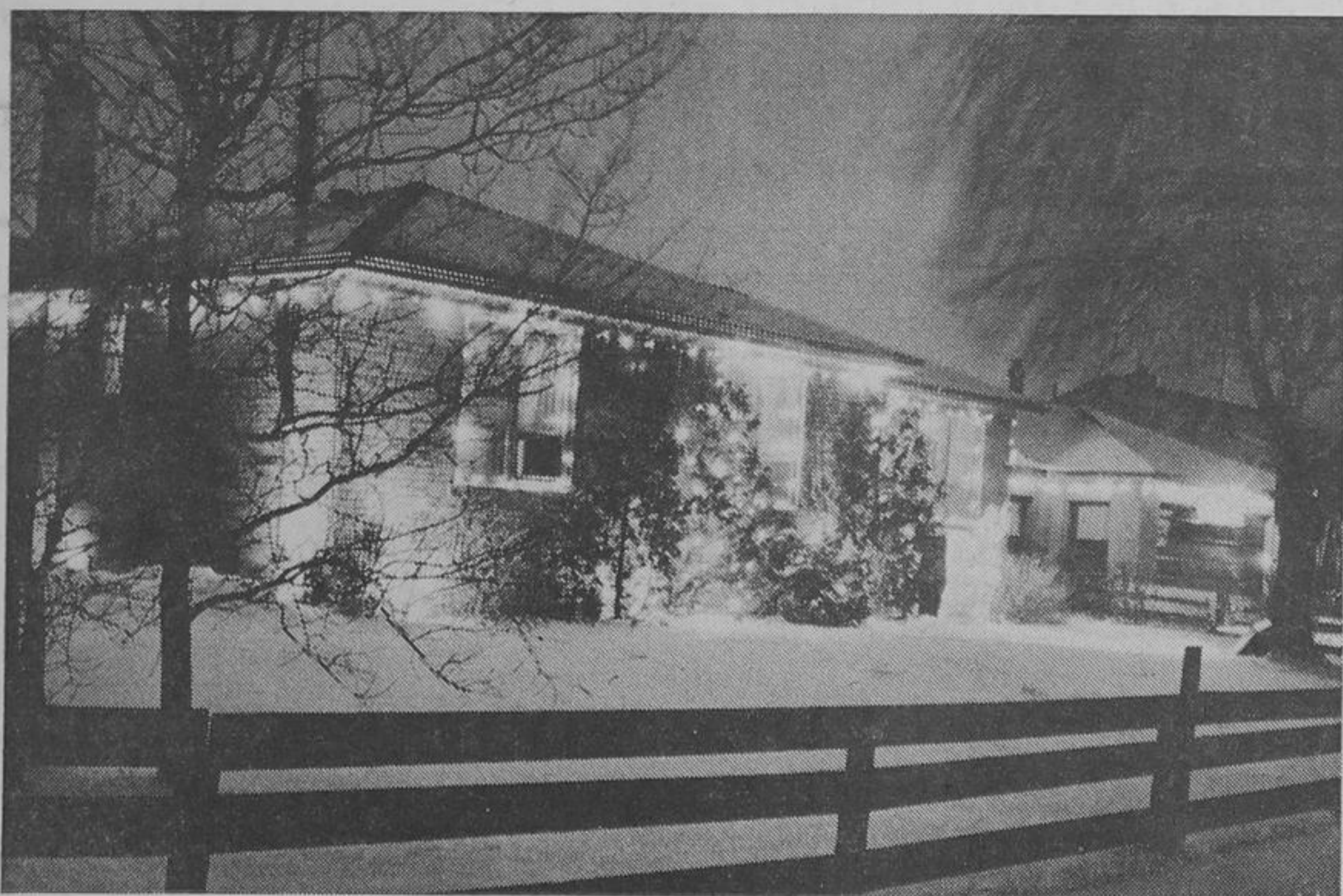


Hydro Contest Winners Make Real Winter Wonderland

"Grand Canyon Adventure", the second of the personally narrated colored travel and adventure films presented by the Rotary Club of Richmond Hill, will be seen at Bayview Secondary School tonight (Thursday) at 8 pm.

Admission is by ticket only, but season tickets for five evenings are available at Aubrey Dunn's Barber Shop, Taylor's Jewellers, Kenzie Drugs, The Playpen or any member of the Rotary Club and will be on sale in the auditorium tonight.

Julian Gromer is one of the real favorites of travelogue audiences across the country. His love of adventure and of people combine with his professional photography and enthusiastic narration to produce marvelous film journeys. Mr. Gromer has produced several travelogues on rivers. In fact, he is a boat-racing enthusiast and has won 40 prize trophies for racing. He has produced films on the Pacific Coast, the Gulf Coast, the Atlantic Coast, the Columbia River, the Amazon River and the Colorado River.

"Grand Canyon Adventure" was produced on one of the most dangerous rivers in the world — the Colorado, amidst the colorful splendor of the Grand Canyon. 32 Students Enrol In Driving School

York Central District High School Board agreed at its last meeting of the year, December 19, to conduct a driver education course as a pilot program.

The course has been organized by Tony Centa of Richmond Hill High School and the 32 students who will take it have already paid their \$25 fee.

It is planned to hold 25 classroom sessions of one hour each, beginning January 9 with one hour sessions on Monday and Wednesdays after school.

As well as the classroom instruction, each student will have six hours of practice driving and 12 hours as an observer in a car driven by another student. The "in car" sessions would take about two hours per group, on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 3.30 to 5.30 pm and all day Saturday. Students will go out in groups of not more than three per car and "in car" instruction will begin after about four lessons of classroom instruction.

Pallister's Driving School of Richmond Hill will provide one car and driver who will teach eight students. The Hill Driving School will supply three cars and drivers and take care of 24 students.

Cost of the course is expected to total \$1,185 and the board has agreed to make up the difference between the students' fees of \$800 and this amount, the total subsidy not to exceed \$400.

All instructors, both in class and behind-the-wheel are to be graduates of a course for instructors in high school driver instruction recognized by the Department of Transport. The behind-the-wheel instructors must also be licensed by the department. Students must hold a temporary instruction permit. Vehicles used will have dual brake mechanisms and will carry \$100,000 public liability insurance, including a passenger hazard endorsement.
