The course has been organized by Tony Centa of Richmond Hill High School and the 32 students who will take it have already paid their \$25 fee.

It is planned to hold 25 classroom sessions of one hour each, beginning January 9 with one hour sessions on Monday and Wednesdays after school.

As well as the classroom instruction, each student will have six hours of practice driving and 12 hours as an observer in a car driven by another student. The "in car" sessions would take about two hours per group, on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 3.30 to 5.30 pm and all day Saturday. Students will go out in groups of not more than about four lessons of class- ger hazard endorsement.

Pallister's Driving School of Richmond Hill will provide one car and driver who will teach eight students. The Hill Driving School will supply three cars and
