**Church News**  
And now it is Centennial Year and the three points on the Victoria Square Charge will mark its beginning with special services. Headford services were held on January 2, with a representative of the Baptist Communion as speaker. On January 9 at Victoria Square Church the guest will be Rev. Fred Jackson of the Anglican Church, and on January 16 at Brown's Corners Dr. D. R. McKillochan of the Presbyterian Church will speak. Dr. McKillochan was formerly a pastor at Markham Village.

**Neighborhood Notes**  
Several changes are afoot for 1967 in this community, although so far there has been no mention of a community project.

In July, Brown's Corners United will become independent and a committee has been named to seek a minister for this new charge.

At the present time water service is being extended to 16th Avenue along Don Mills Road in North Buttonville, with the usual heart rending worry about trees along the line of access. Some have been cut down because, according to the township engineer only four feet of root system would be left on the roadside and this would create a hazard.

Arnold Mortson, who has served as chairman of TSA 2, Markham, for the past two years and was also chairman of old TSA 3 at its inception in 1962, has retired from the school board, and for the first time this part of the area has no representative west of Unionville - a situation which seems unwise.

The many changes in the public school system over the past five years have had parents and pupils reeling in an effort to adjust, but one which is now being proposed in York County would have a much greater effect.

Early in the new year York County Council will be asked to consider a bylaw which would create three boards of education for the whole county. The board for this area would cover the Southern Six Markham and Vaughan Townships, Richmond Hill, Woodbridge, Markham Village and Stouffville and would be responsible for education at elementary and secondary school levels, wiping out all
