

## TSA 2 Markham To Build New Senior Public School Next Year — Plans For A Campus-type Fall Through

TSA 2 Markham is planning a new senior public school for next year but it won't be the campus-type development the board had contemplated.

The hoped-for campus-type development would be a large site with more than one school; preferably a primary school to serve the local neighborhood, a senior school serving a wider area and a secondary school.

Such a development is in line with the emphasis put on integration of school systems by the Department of Education and would operate best under a board of education such as has been suggested by the York County Public School Consultative Committee on Education, but which has been turned down by county council.

The trustees of TSA 2 investigated the possibility of the campus development with Markham District High School Board in the Unionville area. However, Chairman Mrs. Mildred Toogood advised at a recent meeting of the TSA 2 board that the Markham board was not contemplating any new high school construction within the next five years and then only an addition to its present school would be needed.

As a result, TSA 2 trustees have agreed to proceed with negotiations for a school site on Concession 7 of the township, north of Highway 7 on the Markham Village boundary line, where municipal water and sewers would be easily accessible. Land in this area would be much less expensive than served land at Unionville.

Plans for the school, which are being drawn up by architects Hicks, Marsh and McLean, will include 16 home rooms, with possible expansion to 20; music library for science, art, special, library, general purpose, guidance, home economics, industrial arts and health. There will also be additional space for offices, stor-

age, lunch rooms, showers and water found at the construction site at Dickson's Hill School on Highway 48 at 19th Avenue. Property Chairman Elson Miles said last week, "Water wilters, along with other methods of locating satisfactory source of water for the 12-room school, were discussed, but nothing definite was decided."

Business Administrator Wilfred Morley said he would like a decision on an emergency shift system before the end of June, in case the school isn't completed. The board also decided that Mrs. Toogood would be absent this summer, and Trustee Gordon Champion is often away, decisions regarding property may be made by any three of the board members during the summer.

Transportation Chairman Stuart Watson, said that new bus schedules — subject to change — were being drawn up for the fall.

Mr. Morley said that classes at that time will be smaller, because of the stability of the school population and the extra accommodation.

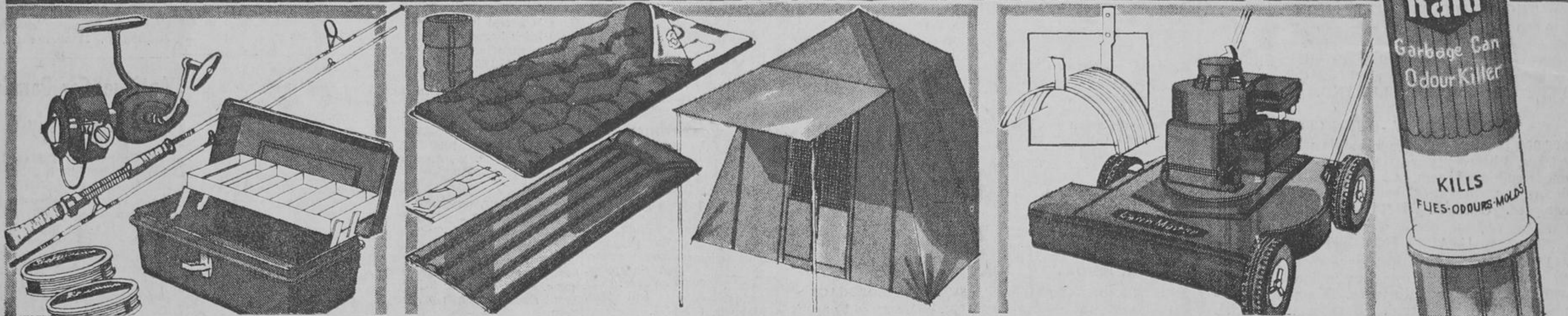

### Wide Variety Of Outside Groups Use High Schools

A comprehensive report of use of York Central District's five high schools by outside organizations was presented at a recent meeting of the board's property and planning committee.

A new policy respecting use of the schools was adopted January 30 of this year. This permitted more organizations to use the schools, eliminated rental fees for some and lowered them for others. That this has resulted in more frequent use of the schools was indicated by the figures in the report, prepared by Business Administrator George Tindal.

In all of 1966 for instance, outside groups used the schools 247 times, a total of 891 hours, while from January 1 to June 30, 1967 the schools were used almost as much as for the entire year previous, 210 times, for 699 hours.

The lowered fee structure produced rentals of only \$550 for the first six months of this year, compared to \$2,398 for all of 1966.

During the first six months of this year, the schools were also used after hours 256 times, for a total of 996 hours for student activities such as dances, drama nights, parents' nights sports events, etc.

Outside organizations using the schools included, Scouts, Cubs, Guides and Brownies, political groups, church groups, field naturalists, mental health associations, cancer society, etc.

The schools were also used for such things as dance and piano recitals, concerts of various kinds, cooking schools and for showing children's films.

The schools' facilities were used for various types of sports, rigger, badminton, baseball, basketball, by other than school groups.

As well, other municipalities and boards used the school facilities, the College of Education for trade tests, the Town of Richmond Hill for the mayor's levee, the Board of TSA 1 Markham for athletics, etc.
