Implied Threats Carry Same Weight As Actual

Implied threats carry as much weight as actual ones, Magistrate Russell Pearce ruled last week in Magistrate's Court in convicting two youth of armed robbery.

Remanded until August 3 for a pre-sentence report were Gerald Brown, 20, and Henry Barandwicz, 17, both of Toronto.

The charge arose out of an incident July 15 in which the two youths took a small quantity of money and some jewelry from the house of Arthur Langman, 22, of Thornhill.

In his testimony, Brown said they had never intended to use their weapons — two spiked railway flares — nor had they planned to hurt the complainant in any way.

He said he realized they had made a mistake later in the evening when Langman had left the room for a period, and had told his companion that they were in a "ridiculous position," and that they should try to get out of it as "best as we can."

According to Langman, a high school teacher in Don Mills, he had given the two accused a ride from Toronto about 2 a.m. and then had invited them into his parents' house, where they had some pop and talked for about an hour and a half. His parents were on holiday.

He said the youths told him they had planned to pick up a homosexual that evening and rob him, and although Langman wasn't one, they intended to rob him just the same.

The threat was the same as if the police had told a suspect that they had intended to beat him up, but wouldn't now. The threat had been lodged in the victim's mind; the flare was an implied threat, Mr. Leggatt said.

Less implied and more overt was the criticism of Ontario's liquor laws by Crown Attorney Leggatt.

Speaking to a case in which the accused was being tried in part for having liquor in a place other than a residence, in this instance, five beers at a family picnic, Mr. Leggatt said: "That's one of the oddities of our law. Unfortunately parliament passed it and we have to live with it."

Magistrate Russell Pearce, who usually fines youths convicted of this offence, \$50 assessed the absent accused \$35 and costs.

Daniel Leonard, 16, of Rexdale, who broke into Grove Motors in Woodbridge July 10 and stole a quantity of cigarettes and gum, was remanded to August 10 for a pre-sentence report, when he pleaded guilty to a charge of breaking, entering and theft.

The youths were then arrested and the stolen articles were found on their persons. When asked by Defence Counsel Donald Plaxton whether he had at any time objected to the two accused taking his things, Langman said that one didn't offer "resistance when being threatened by weapons."

Mr. Plaxton asked the complainant if he told the youths he had been undergoing treatment for a medical problem, and Langman said he had, but it had been a lie.

He said he had never seen the weapons mentioned by the youths, but he believed them when they said they had them. Constable Thorsell said he had stopped the Langman car at 5:25 a.m. after it had gone through a red light.

He also read two statements into the evidence from the accused, in which they admitted their parts in the theft.
