THREE FORMER MARYLAKE SUPERIORS TO PARTICIPATE 25TH ANNIVERSARY
 The four former superiors will be at the Augustinian Community at Marylake from September 3-10. They will be participating in a Mass of Thanksgiving on Labor Day at 5 pm in the Shrine Church in celebration of the 25th anniversary. The public is invited to attend by the present Prior Rev. Cyril L. Smetana OSA, who feels this will offer an excellent opportunity for former friends to meet the three dignitaries, who guided the development at Marylake. The three distinguished guests will be Rev. Athanasius Pape, OSA of Wuerzburg, Germany; Rev. Suitbert Moors, OSA, prior of St. Augustine Monastery in Nova Scotia, and Rev. Arnulf Hartman, OSA, prior of Mother of Consolation Monastery, Ladner, BC. The fourth superior, Rev. Leo Ebert, now stationed in Cologne, Germany, will not be able to attend. Father Pape was the vicar-provincial of the Augustinians in 1942 when Marylake was opened and was responsible for its establishment. In that year he accepted the invitation of Cardinal McGuigan to open a retreat house and a shrine in honor of Mary, and sent a small community to take over the new project. Five years later he was appointed prior of Marylake and served for a term of six years when he was called to Rome to be the economic general of the Augustinian order. Under his direction the retreat house was enlarged to its present size. He is also widely known for his retreats to priests and religious throughout Canada. Father Moors was one of the pioneers at the shrine, a member of the original group. He served as bursar for the first five years and in 1953 was appointed prior. The first sketches for the new shrine and a drive for funds were initiated in his term of office. The new church and monastery was built when Father Hartman was prior. Father Hartman also found time to give retreats and missions and to delve into the history of the order in Japan. Father Leo Ebert was the first prior at the shrine. He was again stationed at Marylake in later years as shrine director and promoter of retreats.

70 Children Enjoying Vacation Bible School

Threaten Stoppage Ambulance Service Unless Subsidized
 Robert Taylor, operator of Taylor Ambulance has announced that he will cut off service in North Gwillimbury Township August 31 unless he gets a \$2,000 subsidy.
 This brought the charge from North Gwillimbury Reeve Joseph Dale that Mr. Taylor was using the subsidies he receives from other municipalities as a lever.
 The ambulance service supplies two ambulances which serve as well as North Gwillimbury, the municipalities of East Gwillimbury and Georgina Townships and the Village of Sutton, all of which subsidize the service.
 Mr. Taylor insists he needs the subsidy to pay for extra equipment required by the Ontario Department of Health. The equipment has not yet been installed. Mr. Taylor advised in answer to a question by Reeve Davies.

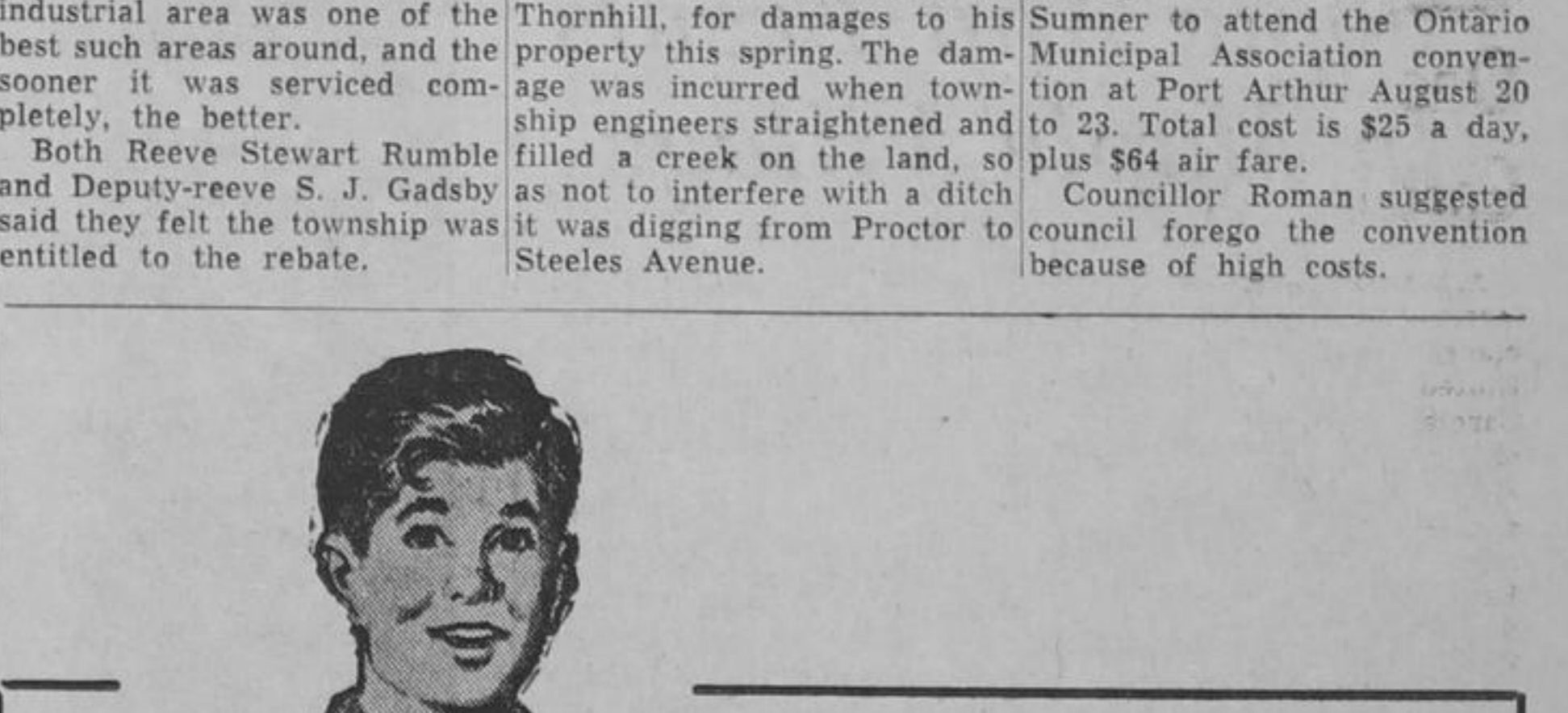
Mkm Twp Council Divided As To Proposed Metro Sewer Agreement

Markham Township Council last week put over to later a proposed trunk sewer agreement with Metro, after opinion was divided as to whether it should be approved, or not.
 The agreement calls for the township to pay \$175,000 as its share of the cost for the sewer,

which will run between Steeles and Cummer Avenues, and will service 770 acres of industrial land in the township.
 However, council feels it should get a 25 percent forgiveness rebate on the amount.
 Objecting to this idea was Councillor Anthony Roman, who said he felt the Don Mills industrial area was one of the best such areas around, and the sooner it was serviced completely, the better.
 Both Reeve Stewart Rumble and Deputy-Reeve S. J. Gadsby said they felt the township was entitled to the rebate.

Mr. Roman said that, if council tried to get a rebate, Metro could show increased construction costs, instead of the agreed price now.
 Council also: Gave final approval to a motion authorizing payment of \$1,300 to K. C. Ames, 68 Almond Avenue, Thornhill, for damages to his property this spring. The damage was incurred when township engineers straightened and filled a creek on the land, so as not to interfere with a ditch which was digging from Proctor to Steeles Avenue.

Approved a pheasant hunt in the township this year, the date to be set by the provincial government.
 Assumed responsibility of roads and services in Mansfield Developments industrial subdivision on Esna Park Drive.
 Authorized Deputy-Reeve Gadsby and Councillor Allan Summer to attend the Ontario Municipal Association convention at Port Arthur August 20 to 23. Total cost is \$25 a day, plus \$64 air fare.
 Councillor Roman suggested council forego the convention because of high costs.
