CPR Offers New Service For Locust Hill Station

A proposal by Canadian Pacific Railways to service all of the Trent Division — which originates in the Trenton area and includes the Locust Hill station in Markham Township — through a centre at Agincourt, beginning September 5, was outlined last week to council by J. F. Crate, superintendent of the CPR. He was accompanied by four other members of the organization.
Last July the CPR announced its intention to withdraw the caretaker from Locust Hill Station, but council asked for more information before consenting to it.
A similar proposal two years ago by the railroad brought storms of protest from customers using the line, and the plan was dropped for the time.
This year, council asked that passengers be advised of the proposed changes and that complaints be submitted to council within a 10-day period.
Last week, Mr. Crate said that, while there wouldn't be any caretaker at Locust Hill under the new setup, Mrs. V. Malcolm, the present caretaker, would be the commissioned agent in the village and would handle express shipments from her home.
The station would remain open as a shelter for passengers with heat probably looked after by the section man, Mr. Crate said.
At present the station is open only one hour a day and is regarded as a flag station.
Under the new arrangement an agent would cover the area by car, complete with a telephone unit, and anyone having difficulty could be reached within one hour.
The service centre at Agincourt would serve the municipality far better than the present service, said Mr. Crate.
There would be toll-free calls through Zenith numbers; data processing and telecommunications.
There would also be other small services which the public would find valuable — tickets for trains and planes, hotel accommodation; locating incoming freight shipments; under the new system freight shipments would come in and payment could be made at a later date through the service centre.
"The new move to mobility indicates the CPR will go to its customers rather than wait for customers to go to them," said Mr. Crate.
There would be 24 hour service, seven days a week, for telegrams and death messages. At present there are no facilities for telegrams at the station, and present information on car-load shipments is restricted, council was told.

DO PEOPLE KNOW?

Reeve Stewart Rumble and Councillor Charles Hoover thought the idea sounded fine for commercial customers, but Mr. Rumble remarked that at the Department of Transport hearing on the same question some years ago "the persons who attended appeared to be persons who waited at the station for pickup by car."
Said Councillor Hoover: "Do the people know what is proposed?"
Mr. Crate said all shippers and receivers were notified by letter June 14, but added: "No notice has been placed at the station — this is not done until the Board (of Transport) gives authority to put the plan in action."
Councillor Allan Sumner asked if all passengers would still be picked up by the CPR, and was assured the same practice as presently used would continue.
Councillor Hoover said he'd "like to hear what the people of the area have to say, direct."
