An English student attends school from nine to four every day and has a five week summer holiday. Parkview School have been re- He begins school at five years of age and spends 10 years in school.

In the elementary school he learns the rudiments of reading, writing and arithmetic. If he catches on quickly and knows the work, he can go out payment but all other on to a higher class without waiting for the end of the year. At the end of elementary school, students are given an "eleven plus" examination. Depending on

the result of this examination, about 10 per cent go on to grammar school, a portion go to technical school or if gifted in art or design, may receive scholarships to attend art schools. A few take commercial training but this is at private schools with fees to pay. Those not qualifying for scholarships to grammar and technical schools go to a secondary mod-

ern school, somewhat similar to the grammar school. Late starters can be recognized here and may be transferred to a grammar school. At 15 the student graduates from secondary modern school. Those at grammar school leave a year later, unless they plan to go on to university, when they would spend a further two years at the grammar school.

The majority of students attending universities have received scholarships and if the need exists, may also receive interest free loans.
