**Roman Out To Cancel Smoking Ban**  
To smoke or not to smoke — that is a question still bothering Markham Township Council.

Three weeks ago the question was broached to council of banning smoking in the new council chambers at Buttonville. At that time the proposal was strenuously opposed by Councillor Anthony Roman, who requested a notice of motion before the question was heard.

However on February 26, Councillor Roman was not present and Councillor Alan Sumner was the only one to speak for the rights of smokers. Council voted to ban smoking on a motion introduced by Deputy-revee S. J. Gadsby and seconded by Councillor Charles Hoover.

"This was a private member's motion and it should not have been passed in my absence," charged Councillor Roman, on March 4, moving that the motion be rescinded. But then he noticed that the deputy-revee was absent, and stated, "I will pay the honorable waiting the courtesy of mending until he is present and withdraw my motion at this time."

Councillor Sumner commented that he had paid a visit to the new council chambers last week and discovered an ornate switch which operates a silent air-conditioner. "Why a fan if I can't use it — I don't like to waste that money," he stated.

Final decision on the "no smoking" ban will be made when all members of council are present.

**AURORA:** A nine-lot subdivision on Kennedy Street West, where the bylaw limits development to half-acre lots, has been proposed to council by Dr. E. J. Henderson, who was mayor when the governing bylaw was passed. The proposal is to subdivide the Henderson, Building and Crabtree properties. The proposed lots will have the 100-foot minimum frontage but would contain only 15,000 to 16,000 square feet.

**STOUFFVILLE:** Rev. Russell J. Pike, who was born in Stouffville, and served in a dozen United Churches in Southern Ontario communities during his 40-year career, died February 27 in Toronto. He was 71. His last post was Harrison's United Church in Brampton. Funeral service was held at Dickson's Hill United Missionary Church with interment in the church cemetery.

# Former St. Paul's Lutheran Minister To Sponsor June Tour Holy Lands

A former area minister is being presented a tour of the Bible lands by his parish, and is inviting former parishioners and others to accompany him. He is the Rev. Albert Myers of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The tour will leave from New York City June 8, and return June 29. Pastor Myers stated that it will be the most comprehensive and deluxe tour of the Bible lands ever offered at so low a cost.

Bible lands to be visited include Italy, Greece, Asia Minor, Egypt, Cyprus, Lebanon and Palestine. Rome, Athens, Corinth, Ephesus, Smyrna, Bhylos, Cairo, and major sites in Palestine and a cruise on the Sea of Galilee are scheduled.

Participants will visit the Capitoline Hill and other reminders of the splendor of ancient Rome. They will stand on Mars' Hill in Athens (Acts 17:22), and see the Tribunal at Corinth where Paul was brought before the authorities.

They will visit such architectural and engineering wonders as the Aya Sofia in Istanbul, the Acropolis in Athens and in Baalbek, and the Sphinx in Egypt.

They will trace Jesus' footsteps along the Via Dolorosa to Calvary. They will meditate on his victory at the garden tomb. From Capernaum to Bethleem, they will visit those places dear to Christian memory.

Several days will be spent in the lake and mountain region of Switzerland before returning to North America. This will afford added rest and relaxation, and an opportunity to visit Reformation sites. Participants can also visit Mt. Blanc, highest peak in Europe, or cruise on beautiful Lake Geneva.

"Truly," said Pastor Myers, "this will be a memorable trip."

**Commit Toronto Man At Counterfeit Trial**  
A 31-year-old Toronto man, Giuseppe Gallati, was committed to stand trial Tuesday when he appeared at a preliminary hearing in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court on charges of possessing and uttering counterfeit money.

Gallati is charged with passing a counterfeit \$10 bill at the PR Gas Station in Unionville January 8.

Evidence revealed the accused entered the station and asked for change for the \$10 bill.

The attendant recognized the bill as a counterfeit, changed the money, and later called the police.

Markham Township Police Detective Doug Tribbling testified that the passed bill contained the serial number W over D-6121726.

Following an investigation Gallati was charged and two \$10 bills bearing the same serial number was found in his possession. Also recovered was a bill bearing the serial number W over D25111936.
