Share Lent '68 Will Help Needy Nations — Canvass This Sunday

Each Lenten Season Roman
 Catholic families in this area
 are canvassed to provide funds
 for St. Augustine's Seminary in
 Scarborough. But this year the
 campaign is titled "Share Lent
 '68" and includes an appeal to
 all Canadians to become con-
 cerned in the solution of the
 problem of world poverty.

"It is not enough merely to
 invite Canadians to be generous
 and show good will. This is a
 challenge of a new and differ-
 ent kind," a pastoral letter from
 the Catholic Bishops of Canada
 states. The letter has as its
 theme that the development of
 needy nations is "the road to
 peace" offered to all men.

The letter asks Canadians to
 press the federal government to
 increase its foreign aid and calls
 for acceptance by all citizens of
 the sacrifices involved in con-
 tributing a higher percentage
 of Canada's gross national pro-
 duct to the nations suffering
 from poverty and want.

It also envisages Canada be-
 coming a leader in the evolu-
 tion of a new economy for the
 nations of the world, by the
 training of leaders and planning
 of development. It calls on the
 Canadian public to grapple in
 an intelligent, generous man-
 ner with the most urgent human
 problems.

Money raised in the Share
 Lent '68 canvass, over and above
 the commitment to the seminary,
 and donations which are
 specifically requested to go to
