Missionary Services

At Local Churches

Services with special missionary emphasis will be featured at local United Missionary Churches next week.

The series will begin at the Gormley United Missionary Church Tuesday evening when Rev. Richard Umml will speak and show pictures of his work in Brazil. In the past 15 years, the United Missionary effort has been most productive in Brazil with a number of good sized congregations formed both in rural and urban centres. Mr. Umml has served in pioneer jungle work.

Wednesday evening the speaker will be Miss Naomi Everett whose work as a teacher in Nigeria has been partly in one of the day schools in backward "bush country" and more recently in the modern teacher training college in North Central Nigeria operated by the missionary society.

The Thursday evening speaker at Gormley will be Mrs. Edna Brubacher who first served with Armenian refugees. In 1939 she and her husband began service in Nigeria where Mr. Brubacher subsequently died. Mrs. Brubacher has continued missionary work since that time in various positions on the Nigerian staff.

The series concludes with missionary rallies Sunday, April 21, when services at both the Beverly Acres, Richmond Hill and the Gormley United Missionary Churches will have a missionary emphasis.

The Cross And Resurrection Are Focal Points

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCHES

ST. MARY IMMACULATE
Easter Sunday will be an exciting day for parishioners of St. Mary Immaculate Roman Catholic Church, when they attend mass in their new church, at the corner of Yonge and Dufferin Streets, for the first time. Although the building is not yet quite completed, they will be able to worship in the new sanctuary on the day which commemorates the resurrection of Our Lord.

The Easter services will commence on Holy Thursday with masses held in the auditorium of St. Mary Immaculate Separate School, Traybourn Drive, at 9 a.m., 6 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

On Good Friday, still in the school, a liturgical service will be held at 3 p.m. and the Stations of the Cross and Veneration of the True Cross at 7:30 p.m.

Saturday the Easter Vigil Ceremonies will begin at 11:15 p.m., followed by the first Easter Mass at midnight (still in the school).

Then early Easter Sunday morning at 8 a.m. the first mass will be held in the new church. This will be followed by a mass at 9 a.m., High Mass at 10:30 a.m. and masses at 12:15 and 4 p.m. During the morning the parishioners are invited to visit the sacristy and rectory which forms part of the new building, so that they may have their first look at the new accommodation before it is occupied.

It is stressed that this is not the official opening as considerable work remains to be done before that happy event can take place.

OUR LADY QUEEN OF THE WORLD

Thursday evening at this Roman Catholic Church on Bayview Avenue, High Mass will be sung at 7:30 pm with the Proclamation of the Blessed Sacrament, which will then be exposed on the side altar until 3 pm on Friday. This service will be followed by Nocturnal Adoration, with the men of the parish expected to be present during the night hours and families during daylight hours.

Friday at 3 pm Holy Good Friday Liturgy will be held with reception of Holy Communion and Veneration of the Cross. Then the church will be vacant until the Holy Saturday service at 8 pm. At that time the Blessing of the Fire and the Blessing of the Paschal Candle will be held. Then the lighted candle will be carried up the centre aisle in the darkened church while members of the parish each will light an individual candle at its flame. This will be followed by the singing of the Exultet by the celebrant and the reading of the Prophecies by laymen.

During the Mass, at the singing of the Gloria, both outside and inside bells will be rung and the purple drapes will be withdrawn from the statues.

High Mass will be sung at 10:30 a.m. Easter Sunday, with other masses at the regular Sunday hours.
