(Continued from Page 1) national unity in Quebec," he maintained. "The people of Quebec are Canadians first, not citizens of France."

"But there is a problem, an economic problem. There is little opportunity for the Quebecker to use the education he receives to use. The opportunity is not there. Capital is flowing out of Quebec."

"The Conservatives can solve this by providing the economic opportunity in Quebec. By encouraging business to go into Quebec."

He said two languages may exist between Quebec and other areas of the country but "there is one loyalty."

Most unpopular speaker of the night was candidate Thomas who drew sporadic catcalls and boos for some vaguely disparaging remarks about his opponents — specifically Stirling and Hurlburt.

Guest speaker of the evening was Senator Wallace McCutcheon of Gormley, who is the federal Tory candidate in York Simcoe.

Senator McCutcheon decried the establishing of an "instant

prime minister such as Pierre Trudeau is. I don't like instant prime ministers any more than I like instant coffee."

He also blasted the Liberals for calling an election at this time.

"Trudeau has shown true Liberal arrogance in asking the people to give him a mandate for the next five years with no new policy to speak of and with a make-shift cabinet."

He predicted the tide was

turning for the Conservatives and that "there is no doubt in my mind Robert Stanfield will be the next prime minister of Canada — after June 25."

Platform guests included Major or Lex MacKenzie, former MLA for York North, the Hon. Dalton Bales, MLA York Mills and Minister of Labor in the Roberts' Government, and Bob Sherwood, President of the York North federal Conservative organization.

NDP To Support Libs?

Four To Seek Liberal Nomination In New Riding Of York Simcoe

Four prospective Liberal standard bearers will contest the nomination for the riding of York Simcoe at Huron Heights Secondary School, May 14 at 8 p.m. Riding Association President Tom Taylor announced this week.

of Kleinburg for the past six years is a strong contender for the northern part of Vaughan. President of Kleinburg Ratepayer's Association and a member of Vaughan Township Library Board, Mr. Griffith has two children and is personnel manager for Liton Systems.

John Roberts, of Ottawa, executive assistant to Forestry Minister Maurice Sauve is also seeking the nomination.

Others in the race are John Medcof, 37, a Toronto and Mount Albert lawyer and Edward Rettig, 52, a Bradford businessman.

Newly elected chairman of York Central Hospital Board of Trustees is Graham Walter who lives on his farm at Dufferin Street and the Maple Sideroad with his wife and twin daughters. His son is now married and lives in Toronto. He succeeds Stuart Parker, Q.C., who served as chairman for two years.

Also on the executive of the board of trustees are Vice-Chairman John Griffin, Secretary Mrs. F. C. Jackson and Treasurer Donald Stewart.

Mr. Walter also chairs the management committee. Mr. Stewart the finance committee. Mr. Griffin the building and

property committee and Mrs. Jackson the public relations committee.

Local Man Covers 23 Miles In Walk

At least one Richmond Hill resident participated in last Saturday's March for Millions held in Toronto to raise money for seven associations which work with the poor and underprivileged people of the world.

David Schiller, 51 Markham Road, walked for the Save The Children fund, of which his wife is the Richmond Hill representative. He was sponsored by his 10-year-old son Mark. "The Liberal" and Carlisle Real Estate, and covered 23 miles of the 32.8 mile route.

The walk in which 25,000 people of all ages participated, started in the morning at the CNE grounds, went north through High Park, east on Lawrence Avenue to Victoria Park Avenue, south to Danforth Avenue, west to Yonge Street, then down Yonge, ending at Nathan Phillips Square. Each walker's pass had to be stamped at each of 14 checkpoints.

Mr. Schiller likes to walk and often takes a constitutional around Richmond Hill. In preparation for the walkathon on Saturday he walked the outskirts of the town several times. Although he suffered from sore ankles at the end of his 23-mile hike, he claims he will do it again the next time such an event is held, but will do more conditioning beforehand.
