Teenage Road-e-o This Sunday At The Richmond Heights Centre

This Sunday at 1:30 pm Richmond Heights Centre will be the gathering place for teenage car drivers as they test their driving knowledge in written and practical tests. The event is sponsored by the Richmond Hill Jaycees.

All drivers between the ages of 16 and 20, who have not been found guilty of a moving traffic violation within the past year, will be eligible to compete. Winners will go on to the provincial championship, and the winners of that will compete in the National Teen-Age Safe Driving Championship, July 16-20 in Burlington. This final competition carries scholarships of \$1,250, \$750 and \$500 for the top three contestants.

At the banquet the door prize, a redwood lawn chair was won by Miss Donna Marie Thornton. Winners at euchre were Dr. and Mrs. Graeme Kelly, Mrs. Graeme Bales, Roy Robinson, and Mr. and Mrs. D. Beatty, Beatty.

The written test will be held in Studio Nine on Levedale Road and will be followed immediately by the driving test on the centre's paved parking lot. Driving skill will be tested in four obstacle-type exercises. Cars will be supplied by Puddicombe Motors, Wilson Niblett Motors, Tompkins Chrysler Dodge Limited, Don Little Ford, Kinnear Pontiac-Buick Limited. Trophies are being donated by Imperial Esso Limited and Trans-Metro Landscaping of Thornhill. Cash donations have been received from Firestone Stores, Tony's Esso, Dan's Esso, Wilson's Esso at Thornhill and Carrville Esso Service at Richvale. Refreshments will be provided by the Coca-Cola of Canada Company.

This competition is designed to give the teenage motorist an opportunity to prove and improve their driving knowledge and attitudes, and to stimulate community interest in high school driver education programs. Last year the competition had 25,000 teenagers participating, and over 250,000 have taken part since the first Canadian Road-e-o in 1956. Entry forms are being distributed by the student councils in the secondary schools.
