The go-ahead decision resulted from a meeting June 27 in the Lord Simcoe Hotel which saw 585 shareholders of class "B" certificates vote 72 percent to sell the 160 acres of property in the vicinity of Sheppard Avenue and Bathurst Street.

The vote also involved an instruction to exercise an option on approximately 450 acres of property near Unionville, the former Deacon ment beside us." The Dea-

estate surrounding two cons retained 40 acres of branches of the Rouge River, known as Glenburn Farms. The Deacons have owned the property since 1915.

One of the former owners, Donald Deacon, Member of the Legislature for York Centre, told "The Liberal" some 400 acres of the property was sold last fall to Glen York Holdings who also have first bid on the York Downs Golf Course in North York.

"The property was bought for about \$1 million," said Mr. Deacon ,"which was well below the prevailing market price. Similar property next to us was sold for 75 percent more per acre."

Mr. Deacon said the property was sold at a relatively low price "because we wanted that type of a develop-




