## 126-Year-Old Mill Now Grinding Wheat At Pioneer Village

Roblin's Mill, latest addition to Black Creek Pioneer Village was officially opened July 25 by H. R. Simonett, Ontario Minister of Energy and Resources.

At its original Prince Edward County site, the 126-year-old mill was first operated by a distant relative of former Manitoba Premier Duff Roblin. It was taken down and re-created, stone by stone, at Black Creek at a cost of \$250,000.

In opening the mill, Mr. Simonett remarked that at one time fish were so plentiful in Roblin's Lake near Belleville that it was necessary to hire a man full time to net fish before they could enter the gates of the mill. Had the fish not been intercepted, they would have jammed the mill wheel.

Visitors to the mill may purchase two-pound bags of No. 1 Western hard wheat to be ground in the mill. Village director Russ Cooper advises that the freshly ground flour will be used to bake bread at the village and that "there's nothing added and nothing taken out."

## O.P.P. REPORT

### OAK RIDGES DETACHMENT 25 Persons Injured, Damage \$50,000 When Bus Overtakes on Highway 400

Twenty-four passengers and a driver aboard a Gray Coach bus travelling from Barrie to Toronto on Saturday evening were injured when the bus lost control in a heavy rainstorm and rolled over two miles north of King Sideroad on Highway 400. Damage to the bus was put at \$50,000.

### Council Turns Down Jane St. Re-Zoning

A request for a rezoning to permit development of a contractor's office and equipment building with open storage on Jane Street, south of Sherwood Sideroad was turned down by Vaughan Township Council recently.

G. C. Romano, who owns 41 acres of land in the area, asked the rezoning of 6.38 acres from its present agricultural zoning. It was noted that while the entire area on both sides of Jane Street in the general area is being farmed, ultimate development of the area will not doubt be industrial.

Mr. Romano's application included a proposal to erect an office building of 2,900 square feet and an attached equipment building of 15,000 square feet. Also proposed was an outside storage yard of approximately 1.96 acres.

Planning board recommendation was that the request be denied as premature pending servicing of the area and the completion of a secondary plan for the area to which the application might or might not conform.

Council accepted the planning board recommendation that the rezoning be denied, without discussion.

The truck, southbound on Highway 27 and driven by John Doyle, 17 Ferrier Avenue, Toronto, struck the car broadside in the Highway 7 intersection. The car had stopped on Highway 7 facing west and had then, for no apparent reason, drawn into the intersection. Investigation was by Constable K. H. Smith.

Two people were injured July 22 in a collision involving three cars and a truck at the golf driving range on Highway 7, just east of Highway 400. Victor Simon, 36 34 Cardigan Avenue, Toronto, was eastbound when struck in the rear by a truck driven by Joseph Langille, 955 Bloor Street West, Toronto, causing his car to veer into a westbound car driven by James Binco, 17, 62 Queen Street North, Bolton, Ont. Another westbound car driven by John Deneth, 116 Nipigon Avenue, Willowdale, in seeking to avoid the accident in the westbound lane, hit the truck stopped in the eastbound lane. Investigation was by Constable R. J. Erskine.

## Police Accident Report

### Man's Drowning In Preston Lake To Be Investigated By Inquest

An inquest will be held into the drowning of a man on July 28 in Preston Lake, just south of Vondorf, Whitechurch Township police report.

William Solowinski, 47, of 232 George St., Toronto, had been supporting himself on an inner tube and had drifted out into the middle of the lake. He apparently lost his grip on the tube which was then carried away by the wind, police say. He tried in vain to swim to shore.

Scuba divers from the York County Emergency Measures Organisation recovered the body after two hours of searching in the thick weeds of the lake.

Solowinski had been picnicking with his family at the lake. He was the father of three children and was employed by the Ontario Government.

Although weekend cottage traffic was heavy, police in Vaughan, Whitechurch and Markham Townships report relatively few accidents, nearly all minor.

A 4-year old Hamilton boy, Kenneth Grover, sustained two broken legs and head injuries when he hit a car July 28 at the Concession 5 and Bethesda Sideroad, Whitechurch Township. Thomas Bosworth, 27, of Keswick, was driving north

when the boy ran across his path, apparently to join children on the other side of the road, Township police report. Kenneth was taken to Sick Children's Hospital, Toronto, where he is reported in good condition.

Thieves broke into the A. J. Shaler family residence, 72 Oxford Street, Elgin Mills, last week, while the family was away on holiday. The Shalers have returned to ascertain their loss.

A haul of ice cream, pop-sicles, and soft drinks was taken Thursday of last week from the refreshment booth in Boyd Park, Conservation Area Vaughan Township. The booth was broken into after closing time.

Richmond Hill police report a quiet weekend with only one incident of note — a high-speed chase down Yonge Street after a 19-year old youth driving a Chevy II. The chase, during which speeds of 120 m.p.h. were reached, ended at Bathurst Street and Steele's Avenue, Toronto, after the youth's car went out of control. Robert Hawryluk, 203 Overbrook Road, Downsview, was eventually caught by Toronto police and charged with dangerous driving.
