Richmond Hill Public School Board has engaged Mrs. Norma Jean Wilkinson (nee Sandiford) as a teacher effective September 1. She has one year and four months of successful teaching experience in local schools and will be teaching a class at MacKillop School originally assigned to Mrs. J. McKinnon (nee Kay Duncan) who has resigned on the advice of her

The office staff has also been hit by resignations. Mrs. Joy Crosier resigned last May because her husband had been transferred to Ottawa and Mrs. Betty Lindsay has resigned because her husband has been transferred to Montreal.

They have been replaced by Mrs. Joyce Patrick, who will although working in the administration office, work the same times and observe the same holidays as a school secretary and be paid according to the salary schedule for that position. The second new employee is Miss Mary Graziani who will be employed as a clerk-typist with starting salary of \$3,550.

TRANSPORTATION

In accord with its transportation policy the board has agreed to provide transportation for eight children on Bayview Avenue north of Elgin Mills Road. Arrangements for transportation to Beverley Acres and Crosby Heights Schools have been made with Mortson Bus Line. The board's policy is to provide transportation when children would be required to walk to school on a road where speeds in excess of 45 miles per hour are permitted.

Because of this policy, transportation is also required for four children living on Yonge Street north of the Elgin Mills Sideroad East. Superintendent Gordon McIntyre reported the most economical way to transport these four chlidren would be by taxi. From January-June the children from this area were transported to schools in Markham TSA 2 and the town board paid tuition fees of \$2,000. Mr. McIntyre estimated costs of transportation at \$450.

### Markham Council Briefs

The Mount Joy School, near Markham Village, will be bought jointly by Markham Township and Markham Village for \$25,000 for conversion into a museum.

The Box Grove School on Concession 9 will be purchased for \$18,900 by Markham Township for a community centre. The township council approv-

ed both moves at its meeting September 9. Both the schools are two-

room schools no longer in use. Markham Township building report for August showed the total value of building in the township in the month was

\$1,136,115, including an amount

of \$181,000 for new dwellings. The report, which was received by council September 9. showed that the total value of building from January to August 1968, declined \$6,574,550 from the value in the like period in 1967.

Total value in the first eight months of 1968 was \$12,075,525. In the 1967 pe od total building value was 3,650,075.

Permits were issued in August for the following commercial buildings: Bramalea Consolidated Development Limited, a shopping plaza at the northeast corner of Yonge Street and Royal Orchard Boulevard, \$500,000; Bay Thorn Builders Limited, five stores and apartments at Bay Thorn Drive and

Yonge Street, \$100,000. Industrial building permits were issued to: Manru Realty Limited, an industrial plaza (six factory units) at Harlech Court and North Green Lane, \$250,-000; Emerson Electric Limited, renovation of building to offices, southeast corner Highway 48 and 17th Avenue, \$20,000.

Council authorized a debenture issue of \$991,000 for public school purposes in TSA 2. The issue is over 20 years at 634 per cent and will be sold to the Capital Aid Corporation. a government agency.
