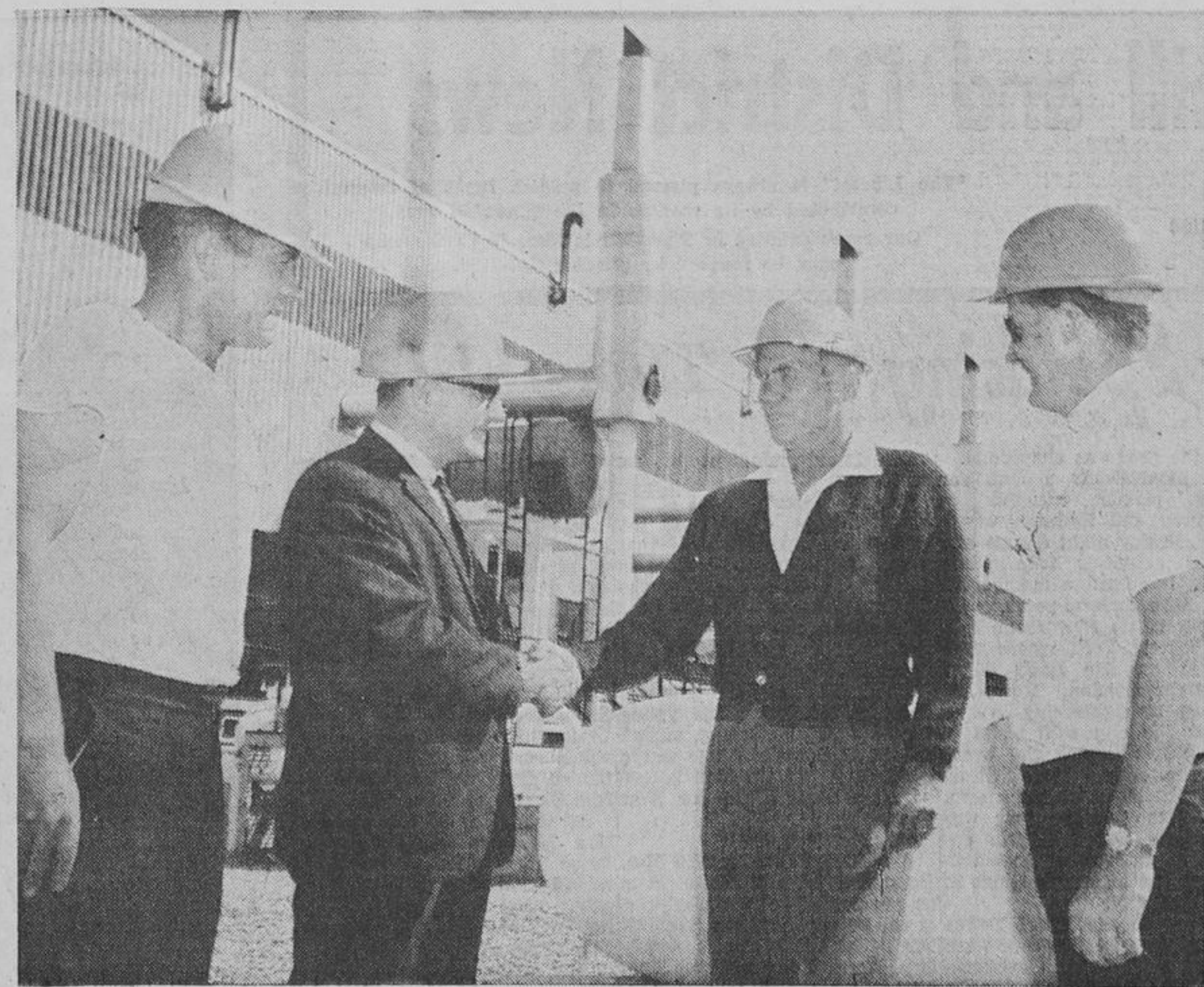

Accident-Free Year For Pipeline

The Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd. Station 130, located at Maple, recently completed a full 12 months without a lost time injury. Besides the Maple station, District 130 includes satellite stations at Oshawa and Barrie and sub-districts at Grimsby and Dawn. Of the 13 districts in the pipeline system seven or eight a year receive a safety award as a result of the TCPL employee safety program.

Safety indoctrination includes teaching proper safety precautions and work methods, monthly safety meetings, safety committees made up of station personnel, first aid classes defensive driving courses, etc., aimed at making the employee safety conscious both on and off the job.

Square Dancing Championships Draw Towne & Countrye Crowds

The emphasis was on "country" at the Towne and Countrye Square, Steeles and Yonge Square, last week when the Ontario Square and Step Dancing Championships were held in the mall each evening from September 17 to 21.

The lively music and energetic dancing drew audiences of up to 2,500 to watch performances by 40 square dancing sets and 25 individual step dancers.

Guiding light of the program was Pine Grove's Murray Morrison of the Old Tyme Square Dance Callers' Association of Canada which conducted the championships.

Murray also served as caller for the Jack and Jill Swinging Couples of Pine Grove who danced off with first place for senior square dancers.

Second in the class were the South Zorra Junior Farmers of Woodstock with the Lambton County Junior Farmers of Wyoming, Ontario placing third.

First place senior step dancer was Neil MacDonnell of Douro, Ontario with Tom Hamilton of Malton second and Donna Storey of Seaforth third.

In the junior step dance entrants, 15 years and under, tiny little Carol Marie Nicholls, age 4, of Seaforth won all hearts and first place. Second was Janice McLaughlin of Listowell and third, Joan Franklin of Moorefield.

Junior square dancing champions were the Canadiana Squares Dancers of Brampton. Another Brampton set, the Canadiana Stepsetters won second place and the High Point Promenaders of Dundalk placed third.

Crosby Ave. Residents Object To Whistling

Four residents of Crosby Avenue expressed disagreement with the recent recommendation of a coroner's jury that train whistles be re-instated in Richmond Hill. The objection was contained in a letter to town council read at Monday night's meeting.

The inquest was held September 17 into the death of Albert Harrand, driver of a car which was in collision with a CNR freight train at the Crosby Avenue crossing on the evening of July 21. Also killed in the crash were Mrs. Margaret Taylor, Mrs. Ena Brake and 13-year-old Victor Stone, all of Toronto. Nine-year-old Daniel Stone died July 31 from injuries received in the crash.

The letter was signed by J. Glover, 66 Crosby; Kenneth Morrison, 65 Crosby; Gordon Bridge, 70 Crosby and Roger Proulx, 62 Crosby.

The writers objected to their families being awakened "all through the night" by whistling trains and claimed that passing freights (when whistling was permitted) often played tunes on their whistles in the early hours of the morning. They suggested that the best answer to the problem of railway crossing safety is "to erect automatic barriers, no matter what the cost."

Mayor Thomas Broadhurst ruled that council should defer any action or comment on the letter until officially notified of the jury's recommendation, after being assured by the town clerk that this official notification had not yet been received. Writers of the letter will be informed that it was read and will be considered at a future date.
