Missionaries In Nigeria Find "The Liberal" Most Interesting

In renewing his subscription to "The Liberal", Rev. Willis Hunking writes from Ilorin, Nigeria: "I do enjoy receiving it and keeping up-to-date on what is going on around Richmond Hill, the people, the places, what happens in the council and of course, we are always interested to know what is happening in sports and 'The Liberal' is our only way of keeping up on this."

This year, Rev. and Mrs. Hunking will have two extra reasons for wanting to keep up on the happenings of this area, for their son Brian and daughter Patsy arrived in Gormley on July 15. Brian is now attending Bayview Secondary School and Patsy is enrolled in the new Thornlea Secondary School.

The other three children, Faye, Garth and Mary attend Rockhaven, a boarding school located at Jon, Nigeria, 400 miles away from their parents. This summer when our Gormley correspondent, Mrs. Charles Milsted, her daughter Charleen and nephew Ronald Gooding of Richmond Hill, were in Nigeria, they spent two nights with the Hunkings in Ilorin and also visited the children at Rockhaven.

Mrs. Hunking is the former Marion Hunt of Gormley, a graduate of Toronto General Hospital School of Nursing. Brian and Patsy are now living with their uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Ron Elliott of Gormley. Mr. Hunking's brother, Rev. Clarence Hunking, served as pastor of Gormley United Missionary Church for some years and is now in Kitchener.

The Hunkings first went to Nigeria in the fall of 1949. Their furlough was due this year, but because of scarcity of workers on the field, they volunteered to serve an extra

year between leaves (five instead of four) and so postponed returning to Canada until 1969. Evangelism is Mr. Hunking's main work. He is the promoter of the Nigerian Bible Conference and very active in the "New Life For All" campaign which takes its theme from I John 5:12. A second copy of "The Liberal" also is read in Nigeria by Mr. and Mrs. Allan Doner, who live in Mokuwa. Mrs. Doner is a former Gormley correspondent for this newspaper.

Public School Gyms In Demand For Activities Of Many Groups

Use of facilities in Richmond Hill's six public schools extends well into the evening hours, it was revealed when a schedule of this year's activities was accepted by the school board, meeting in Beverly Acres School September 26.

BEVERLY ACRES
 Beverly Acres School gymnasium is used by Cubs and the Christian Service Brigade Monday evenings, by Brownies and Venturers Tuesday evenings, by Guides Wednesday evenings and by Scouts Thursday evenings. In addition, it is used for church service and Sunday school each Sunday morning by the United Missionary Church.

CROSBY HEIGHTS
 The town's recreation program will make use of Crosby Heights south gymnasium Monday evenings. This gym will be used by Guides Tuesday evenings, YWCA Wednesday evenings and Guides again on Thursday evening. The school's home and school association will use the gymnasium on four nights during the year. Majorettes will use the east gymnasium Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings and Tyro boys will be accommodated there Tuesdays.

The soccer club will use the

west gymnasium Mondays from 7 to 10 pm starting in mid-January. Tyro boys are accommodated on Tuesdays and the St. John Ambulance on Thursdays beginning October 3 until November 21. The YWCA will use this gymnasium November 27 and January 22, while the home and school meet in the south gym.

MACILLOP SCHOOL
 The gymnasium is used Mondays by the Tyros followed by the home and school on September 23, November 25, January 27, March 24 and April 28. Tuesdays it becomes the meeting place for Brownies and YWCA Wednesdays for the Guides and Thursdays for the Majorettes.

MCCONAGHY SCHOOL
 The gymnasium is used Tuesday nights by a church activity group, the MIA of the Church of the Latter Day Saints, for basketball chiefly. The Brownies meet there Thursday evenings.

PLEASANTVILLE SCHOOL
 Mondays the gymnasium is used by the Brownies and Guides, followed by the YWCA, Tuesdays by the Y and Wednesdays by the Guides and Brownies. Business Administrator Dorothy Street explained there is no caretaker on duty at nights at Pleasantville when the gym is in use, so the board is trying to keep use of facilities there to a minimum.

WALTER SCOTT
 Monday evening the gymnasium is used by Guides, Tuesdays by Cubs, Wednesdays by Brownies and Scouts and Thursdays by Brownies. Mrs. Street reported that all requests had been filled, although not always in the evening or at the time requested, but all groups are satisfied. Permits have been issued which spell out the exact equipment to be used by each group. Principals and caretakers have copies of these requirements.

"At the end of last year we got nothing but praise from the groups accommodated," Mrs. Street told the board. "They all thanked us for our co-operation."

Trustee James Le Moine pointed out that there are only 15 time slots open in the six school gymnasiums in a four week month.
