#### Steeles Ave. Land \$100,000 Per Acre

A report on drainage of the north side of Steeles Avenue from Yonge Street approximately 3,000 feet west to Hilda Avenue will be prepared for Vaughan Township Works Committee by Duncan Hopper and Associates, consulting engineers at a price of \$2,000.

Because of lack of storm drainage facilities, development of the north side of Steeles Avenue from Yonge Street to Highway 400 was frozen by a recent bylaw.

However, there is some capacity available in the North York storm sewer which serves the first 3,000 feet west from Yonge and the engineers will investigate the possibility of utilizing this.

This strip has become prime commercial land and parcels have been purchased recently by Steinbergs, Odeon Theatres and the Ford Motor Company. One parcel sold recently at \$60,000 per acre and the price is now said to be \$100,000 an acre. The area is not yet served with sanitary sewers.




