their one hot meal of the day because of a CANSAVE feeding program.

In Korea, welfare workers were helped to initiate the first factory day nurseries so that working mothers may actually nurse their babies while they work. A rescue centre for lost and abandoned children was set up.

The objective of CANSAVE is to help people to help themselves.

For example, the small nurseries in the Greek villages of Alphori and Korena have become a focus for revitalizing village life, resulting in improved agricultural programs. Mothers are given training in hygiene, nutrition, environmental sanitation and child care.

CANSAVE contributes regularly to support of welfare workers at Hymettus and in Hong Kong.

In Israel, children from many nations are given vocational training at the children's centre, a project of Youth Aliyah, also aided by CANSAVE.

Local committees are being developed in Uganda which assume responsibility for the welfare and improved conditions of their children.

The Eskimo layette program is playing a significant role in the overall efforts to reduce infant mortality in Canada's northland. Warm clothing and blankets are sent regularly to Moosonee and Labrador.

Recent earthquakes in Turkey and the war in Vietnam and other disasters continually deplete the fund. In Vietnam, CANSAVE contributed toward a convalescent centre for children burned or crippled. In conjunction is a creche for the children of widowed mothers as well as a vocational training centre, so that widows and older orphans may learn a trade to support themselves.

HOW WE CAN HELP

Besides the penny beggar bank, the fund has a new and used clothing program with a depot at 68 Hayter Street, Toronto. Diapers and baby clothing are high on the list of needs.

An ideal project for youth groups and Sunday schools is the little ditty bag filled with all kinds of useful and play articles.

Each year, CANSAVE sends special Christmas stockings to many countries. These go to children who have never known any kind of Christmas gift.

Trucker To Be Tried On Charge of Aid After Maple Road Fatality

John Shelly, 24, of Malton, will stand trial in Toronto on charge of dangerous driving following an accident June 3 on the Maple Sideroad in which Thomas Hynd of Maple was killed.

Magistrate Russell Pearce ruled in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court October 24 that there was sufficient evidence in the preliminary hearing of the charge for the trial to take place.

Shelly elected to be tried by judge and jury.

Court News

Thomas Hynd, 17, was killed when a fully-laden dump truck being driven by Shelly demolished his car at the intersection of Dufferin Street and Maple Sideroad at 2.50 p.m. June 13.

According to evidence presented at the preliminary hearing, the truck was travelling south on Dufferin and had not stopped at the stop sign at the intersection with the Maple Sideroad.

Defence counsel, Austin Cooper of Toronto, argued that the only evidence heard dealing with how the accident took place was a voluntary statement made by Shelly to Vaughan Township Police the day after the accident.

In the statement, which was read to the court, Shelly contended that his brakes had failed — they had "gone hard" — making it impossible for him to stop.

He had not noticed Hynd's red Pontiac approaching the intersection from the east until too late, otherwise he would have driven the truck into a ditch, the statement declared.

"There is not a scrap of evidence to show advertent negligence on the part of the accused," asserted Mr. Cooper.

Crown Attorney John Applegarth admitted that "this is not a strong case on the evidence," but argued there was sufficient to justify a trial.

He disclosed that a key Crown witness, a taxi driver who witnessed the accident, had not turned up for the hearing.

The truck being driven by Shelly was a 1967 Mercury dump truck belonging to Gullietti and Constantino Sand and Gravel, of Weston. At the time of the accident, Shelly was taking the sand load to the Jane and Finch area.

A mechanic, Orlando Runco of Downsview, testified that he had relined the back brakes of the truck and readjusted the front brakes about three or four weeks before the accident. He had also tested the brakes with a full load two weeks before, and found them operating satisfactorily.

Another mechanic, Dino Labardo, of Downsview, said he tested the truck's brake drums and shoes and wheel cylinder after the accident, and found them in order. The condition of the truck made it impossible to check the hydraulic lines and hydrovac, he told Mr. Cooper.

Vaughan police officers testifying for the Crown were, Detective Arnold Leeder and Constable R. Blackwell, the investigating officer, who has since resigned from the force. Sergeant Tom Shields took photographs of the scene of the accident.

A man came all the way from near Sudbury last week to testify in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court how his car was stolen from the parking garage of the King Edward Hotel, Toronto, on June 29. But he might just as well have stayed at home.

John Robertson, of Lively, Ontario, was the key Crown witness in the case against two youths, Mircea Copilu, 18, and

han Township Police. Whereupon Magistrate Russell Pearce dismissed the charges.

Copilu and Cole were defended by Alf Stong of Richmond Hill.

Under Bylaw 2425, Markham Township Council has appointed two new members to the committee of adjustment — Leslie S. Council held over a request that the salary of the committee's secretary be increased until other business is attended to.

Council has also given two readings to Bylaw 2426 which would permit a pedestrian crossover on Steeles Avenue opposite Brebeuf Roman Catholic High School. However, third reading was postponed so that a second crossover at the bus terminal on Steeles might be considered also. Department of Transport approval will also be required.

Housecleaning of the township's bylaws will be undertaken by the clerk's office at the instigation of Deputy-reve S. J. Gadsby. The 2426 bylaws on the books will be gone over in an effort to find and eliminate those which are outdated. Examples were cited as one which deals with coal oil dripping on a roadway and another which forbids horses on persons' lawns.

"Don't put a time limit on it," asked Clerk H. C. T. Crisp. "I couldn't spare help that long." Council agreed.

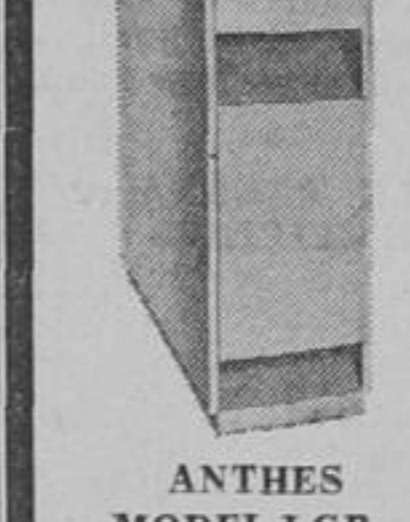
