Art Starr Elected To County Bd. In Whitchurch-Stouffville Area

Only 888 voters out of a potential 6,370 public school supporters — 13.9 percent — turned out to vote Arthur Starr of Vandorf as Whitchurch-Stouffville representative on the new York County Board of Education Monday of last week.
Mr. Starr collected 468 votes to second-running Gordon Ratcliff's 389.
There was no election for the separate school board representation by acclamation by John McDermott of Stouffville.

Wind-Up Session Public School Bd. Has Trouble Finding Clear Date For Meeting

Richmond Hill Public School Board is having trouble holding its third and last meeting. The regular date for this meeting was November 28 — but all board members were invited to the annual dinner at which the town honours its volunteer committees and representatives who serve without pay on various boards on that date.
So the meeting was scheduled for November 29 at Walter Scott School. When the teachers of that school were unable to attend the meeting, the locale was changed to McConaghy School and the time from 7:45 to 7:30 p.m. Again members of the board had had an invitation — this time to the official opening of the new Thornlea Secondary School.
The board dealt with six minor, but urgent, matters of business and then adjourned to meet December 4.
The board accepted the resignation of Mrs. Doris Jantzi, a teacher at Beverly Acres School since September 1968. Her resignation is effective December 31. It is expected that one of the supernumerary teachers will be transferred to this class.
Leave of absence was granted Mrs. Judith Don, from March 15, 1969 to August 31, 1970. Mrs. Don is at present teaching the kindergarten class in the McConaghy Public School and has a permanent teaching contract with the board. Superintendent Gordon McIntyre reported that it is expected a suitable replacement will be available when needed.
The appointment to the position of school secretary of Mrs. Dorothy Turner, at her request, was approved effective January 1, Mrs. Turner will be loaned to the board administration offices for such time as her services are needed between January 1 and June 30. "We can't get along without her," stated Mr. McIntyre, who recalled that Mrs. Turner had joined the system as a school secretary and has been his secretary since August 15, 1959. "She is the other half of my memory," he stated.

FUEL TENDERS
The tender of British American Oil Co. of \$1284 per gal. for light industrial oil and \$1560 for furnace oil was accepted for 1969. There was no change in the tendered price for light industrial and the furnace oil price was up only 2c since last year, it was pointed out. The Kentucky Elkhorn Coal will be purchased from Wm. McGill & Co. at \$16.62 per ton.
CARETAKER
The appointment of James Smith, 41 Cartier Crescent, as caretaker with duties commencing December 9, was confirmed. Mr. McIntyre reported he was impressed by the exceptional calibre of the applicants. "I regretted we weren't able to hire three," he added.
DRAMA CLUB
Permission was also granted for the Walter Scott Drama Club to present a play in the school auditorium December 16 and 17 and set tickets for admission. Proceeds will be used to pay for scenery and playwright's fees and any profits will be used for future presentations. The club is under the direction of Principal Denis Middleton, it was reported.

Police Accident Report Man Dies, Youth Injured In Crash Horse Causes Two-Car Collision

A 47-year-old father of two was killed and a 19-year-old youth was injured following a collision in Maple, November 28.
Dead is Alex Ramon, of Bolton. A passenger in his vehicle, Robert Stewart, also of Bolton, suffered multiple head and internal injuries in the crash.
The accident occurred when Ramon's small truck collided with a tractor on Maple Road at Jane Street during a heavy rainfall. It took mechanics nearly an hour to cut through the side of the vehicle to free the two men.
Markham Township Police may soon have to start a new division to deal with animal accidents.
Last week a deer caused \$500 damage to a Maple man's car. A horse did better this week causing a two-car collision and \$3,500 damage.
The accident occurred December 1 when a northbound auto driven by Roy Robson of King City collided on Keele Street with a southbound vehicle driven by George Theodore of Toronto as both drivers attempted to avoid a horse and rider that had swerved suddenly onto the road.
A 33-year-old Richmond Hill man was charged with dangerous driving after a two-car collision on Steeles Avenue, a quarter mile west of Kennedy Road, November 25.
Leonard J. Fehr of 77 Beaverton Road South was charged after his car was involved in a rear end collision with a vehicle driven by James Robertson of Warden Avenue, Milliken.
According to Markham Police both vehicles were westbound on Steeles Avenue when the accident occurred. Total damage was \$1400. There were no injuries.
A man and a woman were both charged with careless driving by Richmond Hill Police during the past week.
Shirley Sherman, 36, of Jarvis Street, Toronto, was charged following a three car collision at Vaughan Road and Yonge Street, November 27.
According to police, the Sherman vehicle struck the rear of a car driven by Norman McLeod, 28, of 256 Zeldia Crescent, Richmond Hill, which had stopped at the intersection. The impact forced the McLeod vehicle into another stopped car driven by Murray Kemp, 53, of Aurora.
Total damage was \$600.
Bruce N. Vangozen of 47 Bent Crescent, Richmond Hill, was charged after he was involved in a rear end collision on Newkirk Road, November 27.
Police stated that the Vangozen vehicle struck the rear of a car driven by Thomas Brookhouse of Toronto who had stopped in the southbound lane.
MARKHAM VILLAGE, A Toronto youth has been charged with raping an 11-year-old girl of this village and also with attempted murder in Toronto. The second man involved in the local case is still being sought. Charged is Michael John Copps, of Rose Avenue, Toronto. It is alleged he and a companion kidnapped the local girl, stripped and raped her on November 12 and six hours later shot and wounded a man in a Jarvis St. parking lot.

Churches Must Help Retarded, Concludes Inter-Faith Conference

The church has a vital role to play in the lives of the mentally retarded, according to Mrs. A. M. Macdonald, spiritual development chairman of York Central Association for the Mentally Retarded.
Mrs. Macdonald recently returned from a two-day seminar sponsored by the Ontario Association for the Mentally Retarded at the Cedar Glen Conference Centre, Bolton. The seminar was attended by representatives of interfaith committees across the province.
In her report on the seminar Mrs. Macdonald said that congregations can be of great assistance to the mentally retarded by providing retardates with employment or employment contacts and by soliciting community acceptance and support for their activities.
For instance, she pointed out that congregations should actively support plans for community residences and hospitals for retardates in their area. Plans are currently being drawn up for such a residence near Markham Village.
Mrs. Macdonald also stated that churches have a unique role in helping the retardate accept himself as a person of worth by accepting him within their fellowship, and by providing him with the opportunities to experience and respond to God through worship.

Canada has been divided into districts and each district into zones, with individual clubs in each zone. Most local clubs have an auxiliary known as the Kinettes.
Kinsmen are also affiliated with the World Council of Young Men's Service Clubs, including as well the Round Tables, Association of Apex Clubs and the Active 20/30 International.
