Phony \$20 Bills 'hree Passed Here

Phony \$20 bills are floating around Richmond Hill. Three counterfeit bills were reported over the weekend. Two were passed at the Richmond Inn Motor Hotel and one at the liquor store on Yonge Street

Staff Sergeant Joe Rainey of the town police said the bills are a "very, very poor imitation."

He said they are printed on very thin paper and that the face was considerably darker than that of a bonafide note.

He issued a warning to all merchants in the area to be on the look out for the bills which carry the serial number T/E 8621081.
