Sniper Misses Trucker Behind Police Station

A fusillade of BB gun shots that narrowly missed a truck driver who was parking behind the police station sent Richmond Hill Police on a sniper hunt, Monday.
Edward Perry of Richardson Glass Containers, Toronto, was making a delivery to Kenzie's Pharmacy on Yonge Street when several bullets hit his truck. A bystander estimated six shots were fired.
Mr. Perry was backing his truck up to the rear door of the pharmacy which opens onto the parking lot adjacent to the Richmond Hill town offices when the shots were fired.
"I thought I'd bumped into something at first," he said.
Mr. Perry walked around to check the rear of his truck. As he bent over to check the left

rear tire a bullet smacked into the side of the truck two feet above his head. A second bullet hit the top corner of the vehicle as he turned to see where the shots were coming from.
Three Richmond Hill police officers immediately raced to an abandoned two storey shed which overlooks the parking lot 150' away.
The shed was empty. Several police cruisers patrolled the area for half an hour before abandoning the search.
Police suspect that a youth and a BB gun were involved in the sniping.
"The boys at the office just wouldn't believe me when I phoned to tell them why I'd be late," commented a shaken Mr. Perry.

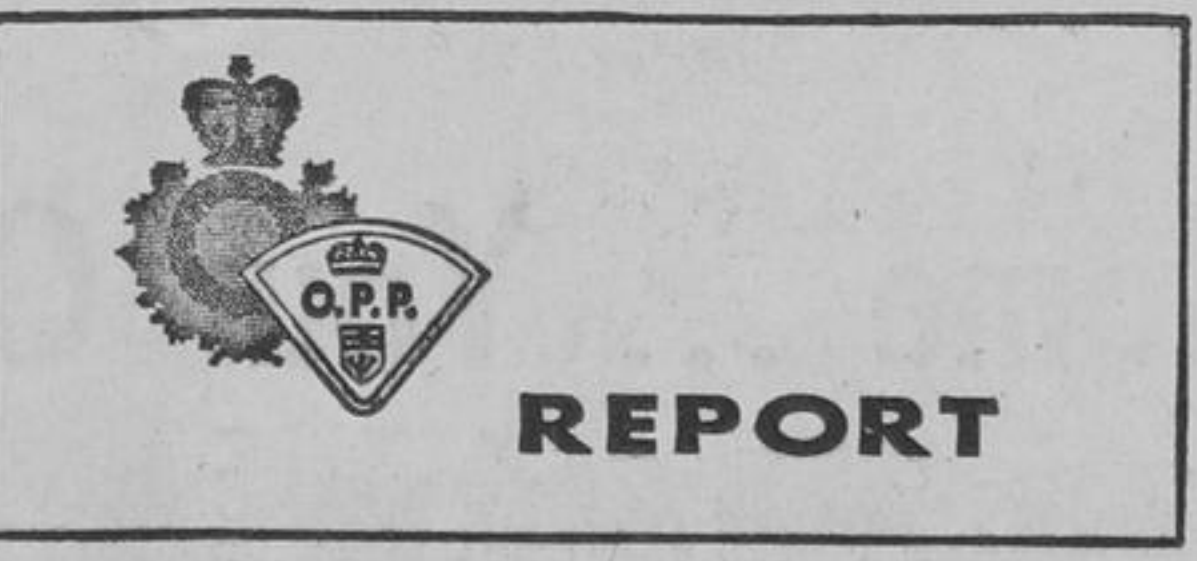
Varley Village Citizens Want Lighting Corners

"There was another accident there tonight," W. H. Williams of the Sabiston Subdivision, told Markham Township Council December 3. Mr. Williams, and his neighbors, Richard Jones and Gordon Vaughan appeared before council to draw attention to the dangerous intersection of Highway 7 and Oakcrest Road (entering the Sabiston Subdivision east of Kennedy Road) in the Unionville area.
The delegation asked that the intersection be lighted before a serious accident occurs. Mr. Williams said it is very difficult to make a left turn into Oakcrest Road from Highway 7, particularly at night and from the west.
He said lighting has been requested and overhead lights have been installed at other danger points in the township but this one was omitted.
It was claimed that Ontario Hydro had this corner on the list to be lighted at the same time as Seiberras Road and Highway 7, and that the latter light had been installed.
On motion of Councillors Charles Hoover and Allan Sumner, the clerk will be instructed to write Ontario Hydro requesting an explanation for the delay. "We will bring the weight of the municipality to bear,"

Reeve Stewart Rumble assured the delegation.
A request for traffic lights at Laureleaf and Steele's Avenue, in South Thornhill, or a crosswalk to cope with the larger population and new development in the area was also received. Council agreed on motion of Councillors Sumner and Anthony Roman to contact the Borough of North York regarding this request.
