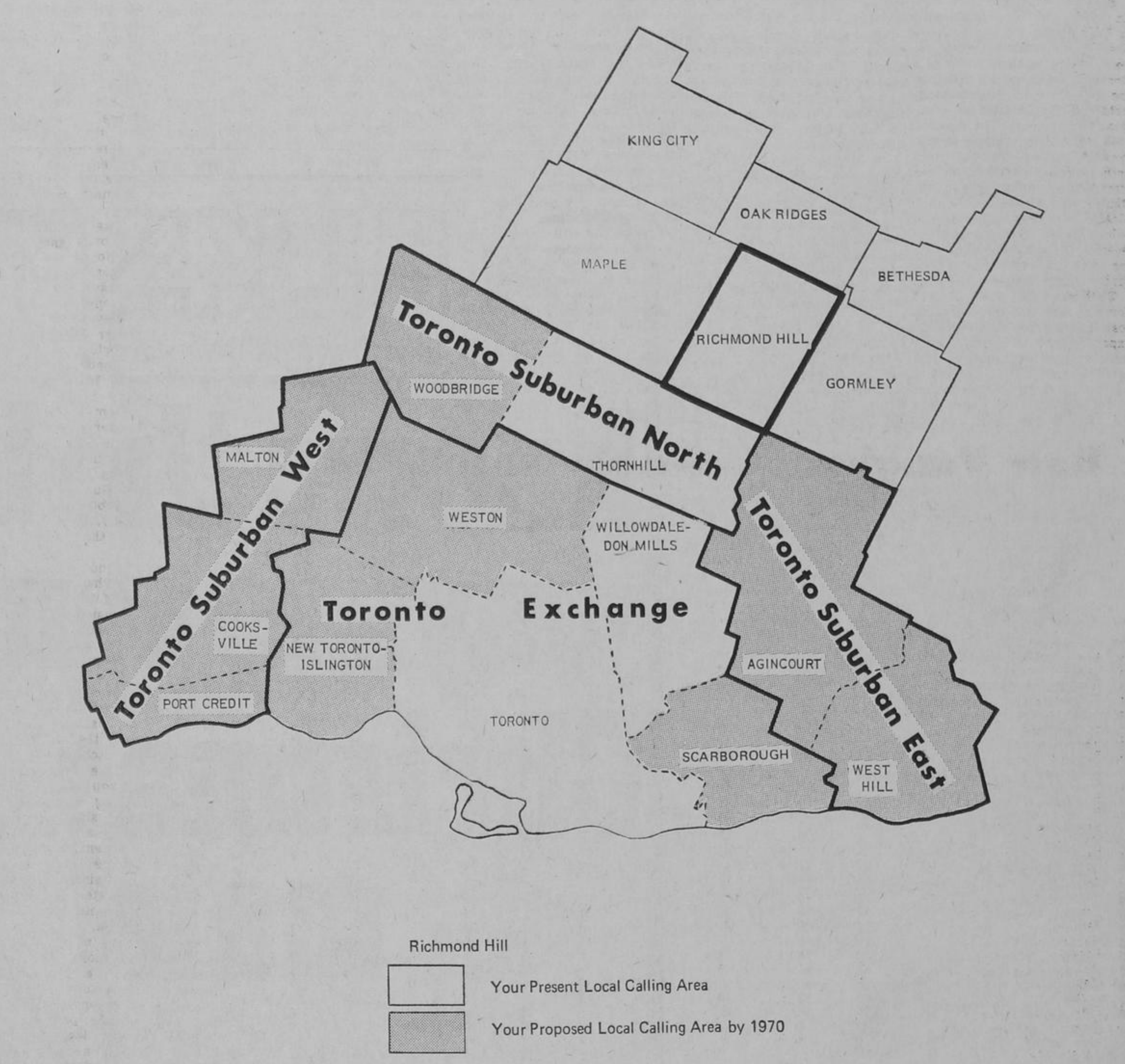

Local Residents' Son
Ran For County Board
 James Miles of Ancaster, son
 of Mr. and Mrs. S. A. Giles, 136
 Harding Boulevard, chairman of
 the combined Roman Catholic
 Separate School Board of An-
 caster was not successful in his
 bid for a seat on the new Went-
 worth County Roman Catholic
 Separate School Board, his par-
 ents learned this week.
 Born in Bristol, England, Mr.
 Giles came to Canada in his
 infancy. He received a Bachelor
 of Science in Agriculture and a
 Master of Science in Agricul-
 ture degrees from the Ontario
 Agriculture College in Guelph
 and is currently head of the
 science department in Ancaster
 High and Vocational School.
 He was elected to the separate
 school board in 1967 and
 became its chairman in January
 of this year. He is a parishioner
 of St. Ann's Church, is married
 to the former Irene Clair, and
 is the father of five children.
 Mr. Giles was seeking one of
 two seats allotted to the county
 on the 16-member board, the
 other 14 were allotted to the
 City of Hamilton.

Car Theft, Burglary
In Vaughan Township
 Vaughan Township Police are
 investigating the case of the
 homeless car that suddenly
 found a home, December 8.
 A car owned by William Pres-
 cott of Willowdale was found
 abandoned and towed to the
 7-11 Auto Compound at Thorn-
 hill. Later that night it was
 stolen from the compound.
 A burglary on Fairview Ave-
 nue, Langstaff, netted thieves
 \$40, December 7.
 Thieves broke into the home
 of Martin Brakis through a
 screen and sliding doors and
 ransacked the rooms and cup-
 board of the Brakis home. They
 stole two \$20 bills.
 A collision on Keele Street
 just north of Steeles Avenue at
 the CN bridge did \$1,600 dam-
 age to a car and a truck, Dec-
 ember 7.
 A car driven by Stephen
 Platt of Toronto smashed into
 a truck driven by Arnoldo Puc-
 cini, also of Toronto. Mr.
 Puccini's truck overturned re-
 ceiving \$1,000 damage.
 A 17-year-old King girl suf-
 fered minor injuries when her
 car went out of control on
 Yonge and Centre Streets in
 Richmond Hill on December 6.
 Wendy A. Smith of RR 3,
 suffered cuts and scrapes to her
 knees when her car struck a
 telephone pole on the northeast
 corner of the intersection. It
 was snowing at the time.
 Richmond Hill Police said she
 was making a right hand turn
 from Centre Street East when
 the accident occurred.

Bell Offers Wider Calling Range, Higher Rates



Local calling to all of Metro
 ban North; and Agincourt and
 West Hill would become the
 Toronto Suburban East ex-
 change.
 These three new exchange
 areas would be given local call-
 ing with each other. In ad-
 dition the Richmond Hill,
 Clarkson, Streetsville, Klein-
 burg, Maple, Markham and
 Dunbar exchanges would be
 provided with local calling to
 the newly enlarged Toronto and
 the three new Toronto Subur-
 ban West, North and East ex-
 changes.
 This extension would mean
 Richmond Hill customers would
 be provided with local service
 to nine more exchanges than
 they have now.
 The proposal is coupled with
 Bell's application for revised
 rates and changes with its re-
 gulatory authority.
 The rate proposal would ac-
 tually decrease local telephone
 bills by 40 cents a month for
 individual residence service un-
 til the newly proposed expan-
 ded local service became effec-
 tive.
 At that time the rates for an
 individual residence line would
 become 20 cents more than is
 paid today.
 The new rates would become
 effective March 1, 1969. The
 cost of an individual residence
 line would become \$6.55 a
 month and \$7.15 a month with
 local calling by early 1970.
 Bell officials emphasized that
 basic telephone rates have not
 been increased in the past 10
 years.
 Reason for the increased
 charge was pinned by Bell of-
 ficials to the substantial sums of
 money required for costly re-
 search and innovation.
 Bell Canada President Robert

Scrivener said the research was
 vital "not only to permit the
 introduction of new products
 and services but also to expand
 and improve the existing tele-
 communications network.
 The expanded local calling
 plan will give Richmond Hill
 exchange customers two-way
 local calling with New Toronto-
 Islington, Weston, Scarboro-
 Port Credit, Cooks-Ville, Malton,
 Woodbridge, Agincourt and
 West Hill.
 As a result of these rate
 group revisions, Richmond Hill
 customers will no longer pay
 the incremental charge now
 levied for city-suburban local
 service.
 They will instead — on ap-
 proval of application — pay
 Group II rates which is for ex-
 changes having a total tele-
 phone count of 1 to 1.5 million
 telephones and with the expan-
 sion of local call, Group 13
 rates, which allows a total tele-
 phone count of between two and
 three million would apply.
