

Exhibit In Heart Of London

Featured in last week's edition of The Telegram Weekend Magazine were two talented young sculptors, David and Royden Rabinowitch, of London, Ontario, who are currently exhibiting at the London Art Museum in the Heart of London, a show comprised of the works of 11 avant-garde artists.

The article, The Maple Moose Forever, includes many color photographs of the Rabinowitch brothers and their art. Although they usually work apart, on occasion they combine their creative talents on large public works of art i.e. The Central Mobia. They were commissioned by the University of Waterloo to construct a large work of art to mark an arts festival and delivered The Central Mobia, a sculpture you could walk on, made up of some 2,500 feet of snow fence. And they plan more of these big outdoor works.

David and Royden, sons of Ruth and Joe Rabinowitch, Kerrybrook Drive, no doubt inherited their artistic talent from their parents - Ruth being an excellent artist and owner of the Ruthe Calverley Gallery and Joe, whose hobbies include professional acting and sculpture, an exhibit of which was held this year at the CNE.
