Hurt Woman Trapped In Her Car After Smashing Into Hydro Pole

It took Richmond Hill Police and firemen 20 minutes to free a 25-year-old woman from her car after it smashed into a hydro pole on Mill Street, March 31.

Carol Kretch of Driscoll Road was released from York Central Hospital after treatment for head and face injuries. The car driven by her husband Albert 26, was a complete wreck.

Mr. Kretch told police that he had swerved to avoid an animal that darted across the road.

Two Thornhill girls were admitted to North York General Hospital, Willowdale, Monday morning, when their car skidded on wet pavement at the corner of Babcombe Drive and Laureleaf Avenue, Thornhill, and crashed into a cement culvert.

Driver of the car Catherine Sklar 16, of Huckleberry Lane is in hospital with a broken jaw. Marilyn Martin, 16, of Babcombe Drive, a passenger, received facial cuts when her head struck the windshield.

The accident occurred as the car was turning onto Laureleaf Avenue from Babcombe. Markham Township Constable John Morrison investigated.

A 25 year old Richmond Hill man has been charged with failing to stop following a two car collision at the intersection of Newkirk Road and Centre Street East, March 27.

Allan Duffy of Centre Street East was charged after he was struck by a northbound car as he attempted to cross Newkirk Road from Centre Street. Neither Mr. Duffy nor the driver of the other car, Gerhard Heeringa, 20, of Emerald Isle Court was injured.

Police estimated damage at \$200.

No one was injured in a single car accident on Markham Road at Lennox Avenue, Richmond Hill, which caused \$1,100 damage, March 29.

Robert Irvine, 21, of Toronto was eastbound on Markham Road when his car jumped the curb and slammed into a hydro pole.

Vaughan Township Police refused to release the name of the driver of a truck charged following a hit and run accident on Maple Sideroad, Maple, on the weekend. No reason was given for concealing the name.

The man was arrested after a truck crashed into the rear of a car driven by Martin Lord of Keele Street North, Maple, at the entrance to Becker's
