Support for this resolution was sought from the other 13 municipal councils in the county

with mixed results. Councils in Richmond Hill and Vaughan and Markham Townships did not go along with the proposal. Whitchurch Township Council decided it needed more time to study and consider the proposal and Woodbridge Village Council agreed that more time is needed to study the form of regional government very thoroughly before

it goes into effect. Woodbridge Reeve John Mc-Lean explained his council's stand by stating that a wrap-up of regional government in just six months with a year for implementation would not be sufficient time to allow all munia proper job. He feels there should be more time to permit authorities to prepare for regional government properly.

He would like to have also a clearer picture of the complete functions of the upper and lower tiers of government.

Consensus of the three councils which were not favorable to the King Township resolution appears to be that nothing can be gained by delay which could hold back development in the area.




