Liberal Leader Robert Nixon's recent announce- new rapport among Protestants "But we are dismayed by the ment that the Liberal Caucus recommend full tax support for Roman Catholic Separate Schools has concerned many people in the riding. Because there has been some misunderstanding about our position, I believe it important to explain why, after nearly two years of careful consideration and study, I gave my full support to this decision.

Firstly, I am opposed in principle to more than one system of public education. The division of our society into two or more groups on the basis of religious beliefs is a certain way of developing a degree of division in our communities at an early age. However, Ontario did in fact grant Roman Catholics the constitutional right to have a separate school system supported by public funds.
