## Markham Council Briefs

Value of building in Markham Township for the first 11 months of this year has been reported at \$12,660,995 down \$3,232,630 in comparison with the same period in 1968.

For November however, building permits issued had a value of \$703,000 one of the highest in the past seven years. New single family detached dwellings accounted for \$405,000

of this amount and addition to dwellings \$5,900. Value of additions to industrial buildings was estimated at \$216,000 and to commercial buildings at \$40,000. Permits

were issued for three agricultural buildings at a total value

of \$16,000. A bylaw will be prepared for rezoning to commercial of lands in Lot 11, Concession 5 between the 5th Line and including White Rose Nurseries property

for a depth of 400 feet. The application for rezoning was presented to council by Cloverdale Campers Ltd., to permit sale of campers on the

Council decided at its meeting December 15 that the planning board would hold public meetings on the rezoning prior to council giving consideration of the bylaw.

Council has approved a planning board recommendation that zoning be changed to R2 on the east side of German Mills Road to the cul-de-sac and for the lots backing on to Milmar Court properties and lots north of the cul de-sac to be unchanged.

Consideration will be given by council to the tender of Cafagna Bros. Construction Ltd. in the amount of \$1,059,949 for Phase 2 of the Don Mills Industrial servicing project. Ten tenders had been submitted for the

The area is bounded on the north and south by Steeles Avenue East and the CNR-Toronto bypass and east and west by the proposed Highway 404 and the hydro transmission line.

Installation of services on Pomander Road was approved by council and will be constructed under the Local Im-

provement Act. Council approved the appointment of Mrs. Mildred Toogood, Unionville as its representative on the township library board for a three-year term.

A decision to appoint council representatives on the Metro Conservation Authority was deferred until some councillors have the opportunity to meet one of the current representatives, Everett Harper of Unionville, township gamekeeper. The other representative is Ward 1



Ontario.






